- AMBASSADOR PERSONELLY DELIVERED LETTER FROM SECRETARY TO FOREIGN MINISTER RIFAL BECAUSE RIFAL IS ALSO PRIME MINISTER, WE TOOK LIBERTY OF CHANGING FINAL SENTENCE OF PENULTIMATE PARAGRAPH TO READ "YOUR DECISION" INSTEAD OF "THE PRIME MINISTER'S DECISION" FOR OBVIOUS REASONS.
- 2. RIFAI READ THE LETTER WITH CARE. WE STRESSED FOR HIM AGAIN THE IMPORTANCE OF THE ISSUE AND THE SENSE OF CONCERN WHICH WE FELT IN SEEING A UN RESOLUTION WHICH EXCLUDED A MAJOR PARTY TO THE ISSUE FROM A FUTURE CONFERENCE ON THE SUBJECT BY RESOLUTION. HE THOUGHT THAT JORDAN MIGHT MAYE A SPECIAL INTEREST PN NOT WANTING TO SEE A RESOLUTION OF THIS CHARACTER GO THROUGH WITH THE PRECEDENT IT MIGHT SET FOR OTHER AREAS AND OTHER PROBLEMS.

3. RIFAL SAID THAT JORDAN HAD CONSIDERED THE QUESTION LONG AND HARD. IT HAD TWO INTERESTS AND CONCERNS WHICH HAD TO BE BALANCED. IT WANTED TO BE HELPFUL, BUT COULD NOT GO TOO FAR OUT AHEAD OF THE ARAB GROUP ON THE ISSUE. HENCE, AFTER LONG DELIBERATION AND CAREFUL THOUGHT, HE HAD INSTRUCTED THE JORDANIAN PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE IN NEW YORK TO SUPPORT US ON THE PRIORITY QUESTION AND ON THE FRIENDLY RESOLUTION BUT TO ABSTAIN ON THE HOSTILE RESOLUTION. HE DID NOT SEE HOW HE COULD CHANGE HIS POSITION NOW AND THAT WHILE HE UNDERSTOOD OUR CONCERN AND OUR ARGUMENTS, FOR JORDAN THAT WAS NOT THE ONLY POINT WHICH HAD TO BE TAKEN INTO

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ACCOUNT. HE TALKED FURTHER ABOUT OUR EARLIER CONVERSA-TIONS IN WHICH HE HAD SAID THAT IF THERE WERE A LITTLE BROADER ARAB SUPPORT FOR OUR POSITION, HE WOULD BE MORE OPEN-MINDED ABOUT A CHANGE.

4. RECOGNIZING HOW DEEPLY JORDAN IS NOW DUG INTO THIS POSITION AND WITHOUT MOVING AWAY FROM CONTINUING TO URGE THEM TO A NO VOTE ON THE MOSTILE RESOLUTION AS A WHOLE, WE SAID WE WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO TELL WASHINGTON AND USUN THAT AT LEAST JORDAN WAS PREPARED, SHOULD A PARA-GRAPH BY PARAGRAPH VOTE BE CALLED FOR THE HOSTILE RESOLU-TION, TO OPPOSE SOME OF THE MORE OUTRAGEOUS PARAGRAPHS, HE SAID HE WOULD STILL BE OPEN-MINDED ON THAT QUESTION, BUT WITHOUT MORE COMPLETE ARAB SUPPORT, DID NOT FEEL HE COULD CHANGE HIS POSITION ON AN ABSTENTION ON THE HOSTILE RESOLUTION. Q: MR. PRESIDENT, IF I COULD CHANGE THE SUBJECT, THERE HAS BEEN SOME SPECULATION THAT MR. COLBY MIGHT BE ON HIS WAY OUT?

PRESIDENT: I THOUGHT WE HAD QUITE SPECIFICALLY SAID NO.

G: WELL, LET ME ASK IT ANOTHER WAY. (LAUGHTER) ARE YOU SATISFIED THAT INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY HAS BEEN FURNISHING YOU WITH GOOD ENOUGH INFORMATION ON VARIOUS FOREIGN CRISES?

PRESIDENT: SINCE I HAVE BEEN PRESIDENT, THE INTELLIBENCE INFORMATION THAT I HAVE RECEIVED IS SATISFACTORY, THE HEARINGS THAT HAVE BEEN HELD SO FAR INDICATE THAT PAST THERE HAS NOT ALWAYS BEEN A 100 PERCENT BATTING AVERAGE, OR A 1000 PERCENT BATTING AVERAGE.

Q: WHAT YOU ARE SAYING IS CYPRUS?

PRESIDENT: I WASN'T PRESIDENT THEN, THAT WAS JULY 15 AND I BECAME VICE PRESIDENT IN AUGUST.

THERE ARE EVEN DISPUTES IN INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY THAT THERE WAS GOOD INFORMATION AND IT IS A MATTER OF DIFFERENCE OF OPINION.



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G: IN RETROSPECT. ON WOULD YOU RATE INTELLIGENCE THAT YOU RECEIVED ON CAMBODIA AND VIETNAM LAST APRIL?

PRESIDENT: I THINK IT WAS QUITE ACCURATE.

Q: PORTUGAL?

PRESIDENTI YES

Q: MR. PRESIDENT, YOU MADE A LITTLE SLIP THAT TIME, YOU SAID YOU BECAME VICE PRESIDENT IN AUGUST. YOU MEANT YOU BECAME PRESIDENTY (LAUGHTER)

PRESIDENT: YES.

G: MR. PRESIDENT, IF I CAN GET BACK TO THIS INTELLIGENCE BUSINESS -- THIS IS ANOTHER QUESTION YOU WERE ASKED EARLIER, I THINK, BUT I WILL TRY IT AGAIN.

TO WHAT EXTENT DO YOU THINK THAT USG THROUGH ITS INTELLIGENC ARM SHOULD INTERFERE WITH INTERNAL WORKINGS OF GOVTS OF OTHER COUNTRIES? THIS WAS ASKED YOU ONCE BEFORE IN TERMS OF COVERT OPERATIONS BUT, OF COURSE, MANY INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES ARE COVERT AND NOT DIRECTED TOWARD SOME OF THE THINGS THAT WE DID IN CHILE, FOR INSTANCE.

I WOULD LIKE TO TRY TO GET A FEEL FOR HOW FAR YOU THINK THE U.S. CAN GO IN THESE MATTERS?

PRESIDENT: I DON'T LIKE TO TRY AND DRAW A LINE ON A HYPO-THETICAL INSTANCE, I HAVE SAID VERY SPECIFICALLY THAT THIS GOVT, AS FAR AS I HAVE ANYTHING TO DO HITH IT, WILL NOT PARTICIPATE IN ANY ASSASSINATION EFFORT. I HAVE SAID THAT STRONGLY AND I HAVE REPEATED IT.

NOW, HOW ELSE WE PARTICIPATE IN COVERT OPERATIONS, I DON'T THINK I SHOULD TRY AND DESCRIBE.

G: I WAS TRYING TO GET SOME FEEL FOR -- IF YOU SPECIFICALLY COULD -- FOR THE GENERAL PRINCIPLES INVOLVED. THERE HAVE BEEN ALLEGATIONS, AS I AM SURE YOU ARE WELL AWARE, THAT THE CIA IS FUNNELING MONEY INTO PORTUGAL NOW AND THAT THE CIA IS BACKING SOME LIBERATION FRONTS IN ANGOLA, AND I KNOW YOU PROBABLY HOULDN'T WANT TO COMMENT ON THAT.

BUT I WAS WONDERING IF YOU COULD ENLIGHTEN US AS FAR AS THE PRINCIPLES INVOLVED IN THIS SORT OF THING.



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PRESIDENT: I DON'T THINK I SHOULD COMMENT ON EITHER OF THE SPECIFICS, AND IF I TRY TO DRAW A PRESCRIPTION FOR YOU AND THEN IN EFFECT FOR ANY SUBSEQUENT DEVELOPMENTS THAT TAKE PLACE IN OTHER COUNTRIES, I THINK IT LEADS TO EITHER MISINTERPRETATION OR MISINFORMATION OR COULD, I THINK, INTERFERE WITH WHATEVER ACTION WE TAKE.

Q: BUT YOU DON'T DISAVOW THE IDEA THAT THE U.S. MIGHT, THROUGH CLANDESTINE MEANS, TRY TO INFLUENCE THE INTERNAL POLITICS OF ANOTHER COUNTRY?

PRESIDENT: I WOULDN'T PUT IT THAT WAY, NO. I THINK HIS-TORICALLY AND IN THE FUTURE THE U.S. MAY HAVE A NATIONAL INTEREST IN SOME OTHER COUNTRY BUT I DON'T THINK IT IS WISE, UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, FOR ME TO TRY TO DEFINE JUST HOW SUCH AN INTEREST WOULD BE UNDERTAKEN.

I MEAN, MANY COUNTRIES THROUGHOUT THE WORLD WE KNOW HAVE AN INTEREST IN WHAT IS GOING ON IN THE U.S. IT IS AN UNDERSTOOD SITUATION AND WE CAN'T BE OBLIVIOUS TO IT. BUT I AM NOT GOING TO DEFINE, AS I SAID A MOMENT AGO, ANY WAY IN WHICH WE MIGHT, IF WE EVER DO.

Q: BY THIS, DO YOU MEAN THAT YOU THINK OTHER COUNTRIES --I KNOW THEY HAVE AN INTEREST IN IT -- BUT OTHER COUNTRIES ARE TRYING, THROUGH CLANDESTINE MEANS, TO INPLUENCE POLI-TICAL EVENTS?

PRESIDENT: FROM TIME TO TIME, HISTORICALLY, AGENTS OF OTHER COUNTRIES HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THE U.S., CONVICTED AND PUT IN JAIL.

Q: MAY I CHANGE THE SUBJECT? TWO DAYS AGO A VIETNAMESE SHIP LEFT GUAM, WITH 1506-SOME REPUGEES WHO SAID THEY WANTED TO RETURN HOME.

PRESIDENT: AND HE CAREFULLY CHECKED IT.

Q: CHECKED EACH REFUGEE?

PRESIDENT: THAT IS WHAT I UNDERSTAND.

Q: IF HE ARE TO BELIEVE THE NEWS COMING OUT OF THAT AREA OF THE WORLD, THEY WILL NOT BE WELCOME WHEN THEY GET THERE.

PRESIDENT: THAT IS WHAT SAIGON HAS SAID.

Q: AT WHAT POINT DOES THE U.S. DECIDE IT NO LONGER HAS AN OBLIGATION TO THESE PEOPLE, WHEN THEY LEFT?



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PRESIDENT: IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT EACH OF THESE PEOPLE WAS CAREFULLY CHECKED TO MAKE SURE THEY WANTED REPATRIATION AND THAT THIS WAS A SOUTH VIETNAMESE SHIP, AND THAT THERE HERE AMONG THOSE 1500-PLUS FULLY QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS TO OPERATE THE SHIP. AMPLE SUPPLIES HERE PUT ON BOARD AND THEY ARE NOW GOING BACK WHERE THEY CLEARLY INDICATED THEY WANTED TO. I THINK OUR OBLIGATION AS A COUNTRY HAS ENDED.

Q: WHAT IF THEY ARE NOT ACCEPTED WHEN THEY GET THERE AND NOT ALLOWED TO LAND?

PRESIDENT: I WOULD THEN SUGGEST THAT THERE IS THE UNITED NATIONS -- WHAT DO THEY CALL IT?

G: COMMISSION ON REFUGEES.

PRESIDENT: UNITED NATIONS COMMISSION ON REFUGEES.

Q: ARE THEY JUST TO SAIL AROUND THE SOUTH PACIFIC THEN?

PRESIDENT: HE HAVE NO RIGHT TO TAKE THEM BACK, THEY SAID THEY DIDN'T WANT TO STAY UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE U.S.

Q: DID THIS GOVT CONSULT WITH THE UN COMMISSION ON REFUGEES

PRESIDENT: I CAN'T TELL YOU THAT, I DON'T KNOW. BUT I THINK, OR I BELIEVE THEY HAVE BEEN WARNED OF THE SITUATION.

G: WERE THERE ANY CONTACTS BY THIS GOVT THROUGH THIRD PARTIES WITH THE SAIGON GOVT?

PRESIDENT: I CAN'T SAY THAT FOR CERTAIN, BUT I ASSUME IT WAS DONE.

G: TO GAUGE WHAT? THEIR ATTITUDE TOWARD --

PRESIDENT: I ASSUME THE SAIGON GOVT HAS TOLD WHAT WAS GOING TO BE DONE BUT I CAN'T CATEGORICALLY SAY YES OR NO.

G: MR. PRESIDENT, SEVERAL MEMBERS OF CONGRESS, SENATOR MANSFIELD, I THINK, HAS ONE, CALLED FOR NORMALIZATION OF RELATIONS WITH CAMBODIA AND THE TWO VIETNAMS. I AM WONDERING IF THERE HAS BEEN ANY CHANGE IN YOUR POSITION ON THIS OR WHETHER YOU THINK THAT THIS MIGHT BE IN THE OFFING?

PRESIDENT: THERE IS NO CHANGE IN OUR ATTITUDE OR IN OUR DECISION. WE ARE ALWAYS IN A SITUATION LIKE THAT STUDYING



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THE CIRCUMSTANCES BUT THERE HAS BEEN NO CHANGE AT ALL.

Q: WHAT IMPACT WOULD THERE BE ON THE MIDDLE EAST AGREEMENT IF CONGRESS DID NOT ACCEPT YOUR RECOMMENDATIONS IN A SIGNIFICANT DEGREE ON AID TO BOTH ISRAEL AND EGYPT? SUPPOSING THERE WERE SOME SIGNIFICANT CUTS -- HOW WOULD THIS AFFECT THIS AGREEMENT?

PRESIDENT: IT COULD HAVE A BAD EFFECT. BUT BOTH COUNTRIES HAVE BEEN TOLD BY ME, OR BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE ON MY BEHALF, THAT WHATEVER AREAS OR AMOUNTS WE TALKED ABOUT WERE SUBJECT TO CONGRESSIONAL ACTION. SO THEY ARE FULLY APPRISED OF THAT POSSIBILITY.

BUT AS FAR AS THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH IS CONCERNED. WE HAVE AN UNDERSTANDING THAT WE WOULD RECOMMEND CERTAIN AMOUNTS. I HOPE THE CONGRESS RESPONDS.

Q: WHAT IS YOUR ASSESSMENT OF THE PROSPECTS OF GETTING CLOSE TO WHAT YOU ASKED FOR?

PRESIDENTE I THINK WE HAVE A REASONABLY GOOD CHANCE OF GETTING IT. I CERTAINLY MOPE SO.

G: DO YOU EXPECT TO BE SEEING PRESIDENT ASSAD?

PRESIDENT: THERE HAS BEEN NO DECISION ON THAT. THERE ARE STILL SOME DISCUSSIONS GOING ON BUT NOT FIRM DECISION.

G: ANY INDICATION OF SOME ROOM FOR PROGRESS ON THE SYRIAN FRONT?

PRESIDENT: AS WE SAID, SINAI AGREEMENT IS ANOTHER STEP TOWARD AN OVERALL AGREEMENT. HE WILL CERTAINLY WORK WITH THE TWO COUNTRIES. RIGHT AT THE MOMENT THERE IS NOT WHAT YOU HOULD CALL AFFIRMATIVE ACTION, BUT I THINK SUCH A STEP HOULD BE CONSTRUCTIVE IF THE PARTIES CAN AGREE AGAIN TOWARD AN OVERALL SETTLEMENT, BUT I WOULDN'T PRE-JUDGE AT THIS POINT, WE BETTER GET ONE IMPLEMENTED AND EXECUTED BEFORE WE TAKE ANOTHER STEP BECAUSE THAT WILL BE A VERY DIFFICULT ONE AS WELL.

G: MR. PRESIDENT, HAVE YOU SEEN ANY INCLINATION ON THE PART OF THE ISRAELIS TO STALL ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS AGREEMENTY

PRESIDENT: THIS AGREEMENT?

G: THIS AGREEMENT, UNTIL SOME PROGRESS COULD BE MADE ON THE GOLAN HEIGHTS?



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PRESIDENT: NO. I AM NOT SURE I UNDERSTAND.

G: HELL, TO STALL --

PRESIDENT: LET ME SAY I SEE NO HESITATION ON THE PART OF EITHER EGYPT OR ISRAEL TO STALL ON THIS AGREEMENT. INGERSOLL BT

CHOU ENGLAI IS "VERY ILL AND I THINK HE'S DYING, " HENRY KISSINGER TOLD SOME CANADIAN PRIENDS IN OTTAWA THE OTHER DAY WHEN HE THOUGHT HE WAS SPEAKING PRIVATELY, BUT WAS ACTUALLY BEING OVERHEARD BY A REPORTER.

3. HE MIGHT HAVE ADDED THAT THE LATEST PEKING REVIEW PICTURE OF MAD TRE-TUNG GREETING A FOREIGN VISITOR MAKES THAT CHINESE LEADER LOOK VERY OLD INDEED, INEVITABLY RAISING QUESTIONS ABOUT HIS HOLD ON LIFE. AND AMONG PROFESSIONAL KREMLINOLOGISTS THERE IS RISING SUSPICION THAT LEONID I. BREZHNEV'S MYSTERIOUS AND CHRONIC AILMENT IS REALLY CANCER WHICH IS MAKING RELENTLESS PROGRESS.

THE PROSPECT SEEMS ALMOST CERTAIN THAT IN THE SECOND HALF OF THE 1970'S LEADERS FROM LONG DENIED YOUNGER GENERATIONS WILL TAKE THE HELM OF THE TWO MAJOR COMMUNIST POWERS.

THERE ARE OF COURSE MANY CANDIDATES FOR THE HIGH POSTS MESSRS. MAD, CHOU, BREZHNEY AND OTHERS OF THEIR AGE GROUP ARE GOING TO VACATE. BUT THE DETAILS OF THE MOSCOW AND PEKING POWER STRUGGLES ARE SUFFICIENTLY WELL HIDDEN SO THAT NOBODY IN THE WEST CAN REALLY DO MUCH MORE THAN SUESS ABOUT WHO WILL RULE THE SOVIET UNION AND CHINA AFTER TODAYIS LEADERS.

6. WHAT WESTERNERS CAN DO IS TO IDENTIFY THE PRINCIPAL ISSUES WHICH ARISE AS THE MAJOR SUCCESSION CRISES IN MOSCOW AND PEKING COME EVEN CLOSER.

FEW HESTERNERS CAN CLAIM THAT THEY PICKED STALIN AS LENIN'S SUCCESSOR BEFORE THE LATTER'S DEATH, OR KRUSHCHEV AS THE MAN WHO WOULD SUCCEED STALIN. BUT IN RETROSPECT IT IS PLAIN THAT IN BOTH CASES WESTERN ANALYSTS DID UNDER-STAND AND ENUNCIATE THE KEY ISSUES DIVIDING THE RIVALS FOR EACH SUCCESSION, ISSUES THAT HELPED DECIDE THE FINAL OUTCOME.

8. IN CHINA NOW THE CHIEF QUESTION IS EVEN MORE FUNDA-MENTAL THAN MERELY THAT OF IDENTIFYING THE NEXT LIKELY BENEFICIARY OF A FUTURE CHINESE CULT OF PERSONALITY. THE CENTRAL ISSUE IS WHETHER THIS HUGE AND POPULOUS LAND CAN REMAIN WHOLE WHEN THE IMMENSE PRESTIGE OF MAD AND CHOU IS NO LONGER AVAILABLE TO BUTTRESS THE CAUSE OF NATIONAL UNITY.

9. FOR MUCH OF THIS CENTURY BEFORE MADIS VICTORY IN 1949, CHINA WAS MERELY A GEOGRAPHICAL EXPRESSION AND THE REALITY WAS A COUNTRY DIVIDED INTO THE HOSTILE FIEFDOMS OF RIVAL HARLORDS. THE NEAR BREAKDOWN OF CHINESE CENTRALGOVERNMENT RULE AT THE HEIGHT OF THE "GREAT PROLETARIAN CULTURAL REVOLUTION" IN THE LATE 1966'S WAS A SOBERING REMINDER THAT SIMILAR TENSIONS AND POSSIBILITIES STILL EXIST. MOREOVER, CHINAIS POWERFUL NORTHERN NEIGHBOR HAS EVERY INCENTIVE TO ENCOURAGE DIVISION AND DISUNITY AMONG THE CHINESE.



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18. BUT EVEN IF CHINA REMAINS UNITED AFTER MAD, IT IS ALREADY EVIDENT THAT THERE HILL BE BITTER DEBATE ABOUT CONTINUING HIS MAJOR LINE OF FOREIGN POLICY. TODAY CHINA "LEANS TOWARD" THE UNITED STATES AND REGARDS THE SOVIET UNION AS THE MAIN ENEMY. BUT IN THE 1950'S CHINA'S PUBLIC FOREIGN POLICY WAS ONE OF SEEMING INTIMATE ALLIANCE WITH THE SOVIET UNION AND BITTER ENMITY TOWARD THE UNITED STATES. IT WOULD BE SURPRISING IF THERE WERE NO INFLUENCE TIAL FIGURES IN PEKING WHO DID NOT FIND A REVERSION TO THE EARLIER POLICY ATTRACTIVE.

THERE AS ALREADY BEEN WESTERN SPECULATION THAT THE RECENT SHARP PEKING CRITICISM OF THE UNITED STATES, NOMINALLY INSPIRED BY ALLEGED WASHINGTON SUPPORT FOR TIBETAN SEPARATISTS, REFLECTS THE GROWING STRENGTH OF CHINESE LEADERS WHO QUESTION THE VALUE OF THE DIVIDENDS RECEIVED SO FAR FROM THE PEKING-WASHINGTON LINK.

12, IN MOSCOW, THE HIDDEN GREAT ISSUE IS THAT OF DETENTE. MR. BREZHNEV'S POLICY HAS BEEN BASED UPON THE ASSUMPTION THAT IN THE CURRENT HISTORICAL EPOCH THERE WILL BE NO GREAT, SUDDEN CATACLYSM IN THE CAPITALIST WORLD. FORE, THE SOVIET UNION MUST COOPERATE WITH THE WEST FOR ITS OWN GOOD, WHILE OPING AT MOST TO MAKE ONLY MARGINAL GAINS--AS IN PORTUGAL AND VIETNAM--TOWARD THE GREAT GOAL OF WORLD COMMUNISM.

13. BUT THERE ARE SKEPTICS IN MOSCOW WHO SEE THIS AS A CRAVEN OLD MAN'S MISREADING OF CURRENT EVENTS, THESE SKEPTICS ARGUE THAT NOW IS THE TIME OF THE WORLD CRISIS OF CAPATALISM.

14. IN THIS VIEW, THE COMBINATION OF WORLD RECESSION, MASSIVE AMERICAN DISORIENTATION BORN OF VIETNAM AND WATERGATE, AND THE TREND TOWARD THE LEFT IN COUNTRIES AS DIFFERENT AS BRITAIN, ITALY AND SWEDEN HAS CREATED UN-PRECEDENTED OPPORTUNITIES FOR A SOVIET "FORWARD POLICY" AIMED AT MOSCOW'S "HISTORIC INTERNATIONAL OBLIGATION."

15. AN EXPERIENCED DIPLOMAT ONCE REMARKED THAT NO NATION HAS PERMANENT FRIENDS OR PERMANENT ENEMIES, ONLY



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PERMINENT INTERESTS. BUT THERE IS NO GUARANTEE THAT ONE GENERATION HILL VIEW THOSE "PERMANENT INTERESTS" WITH THE SAME EYES THAT ITS PREDECESSORS DID. THAT IS WHY THE NEXT ONE, TWO OR THREE YEARS IN WHICH THE HISTORIC SHIFT OF GENERATIONS TAKES PLACE IN MOSCOW AND PEKING ARE LIKELY TO BE PARTICULARLY WORRISOME. (END TEXT.) INGERSOLL BT

1. HEREWITH FULL TEXT MARQUIS CHILDS COLUMN ON OPHED PAGE, HASHINGTON POST, TUESDAY, OCTOBER 21, HEADED "DESTROYING DIPLOMACY."

2. THE SELF-DESTRUCT MECHANISM BUILT INTO THE AMERICAN SYSTEM OF DIVIDED POWERS WAS SELDOM SHOWN IN A MORE PURE AND MALEVOLENT FORM THAN IT IS TODAY. WHILE THE RECORD ABOUNDS WITH THE DIRE CONSEQUENCES OF WARS BETWEEN THE EXECUTIVE AND THE CONGRESS OVER FOREIGN POLICY DECISIONS INVOLVING AMERICA'S POSITION IN THE WORLD, THE STAKES ARE AS HIGH AS ANY IN THE PAST.

ESSENTIALLY IT IS PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST AND WHAT STILL ANOTHER CONFLICT CAN MEAN. IN THE IMMEDIATE CONTEXT THE QUESTION IS WHETHER ANY SECRETARY OF STATE CAN CARRY OUT POLICY DECISIONS WITH ELEMENTS IN CONGRESS BENT ON FRUSTRATING HIM AND ULTIMATELY DESTROYING HIM.

4. IN THE COURSE OF HIS LONG, PAINSTAKING, PERSONAL DIPLOMACY IN THE MIDDLE EAST, SECRETARY OF STATE HENRY KISSINGER WON THE CONFIDENCE AND INDEED THE FRIENDSHIP OF

PRESIDENT ANNAR SADAT OF EGYPT. THAT WAS ONE REASON SADAT WAS WILLING TO ENTER INTO A DISENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT WITH ISRAEL, DESPITE THE HOSTILITY OF HIS ARAB NEIGHBORS



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AND THE DANGER THAT THEIR ENMITY MIGHT TAKE VIOLENT FORM.

5. THE AGREEMENT FINALLY SIGNED CONTAINED A SERIES OF SECRET PROTOCOLS PROMISING ISRAEL MILITARY ASSISTANCE IN COMPENSATION FOR THE TERRITORY SURRENDERED IN THE SINAL. PROVIDED IN AT LEAST 50 COPIES TO SEVERAL COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS, THOSE PROTOCOLS WERE LEAKED TO THE PRESS. AS ONE OF THE PRINCIPALS DEALING WITH THE WHOLE MATTER PUT IT, "NOTHING COULD HAVE BEEN CALCULATED TO MAKE SADAT'S POSITION MORE DIFFICULT THAN WHAT IT ALREADY WAS. "

6. BUT THAT WAS ONLY THE BEGINNING. AT LEAST AS PRINTED, THE STATE DEPARTMENT COULD DISAVON THE DISCLOSURE AS INACCURATE AND EXAGGERATED. CERTAINLY THE PROMISES SEEMED ON THE GENEROUS SIDE.

7. AT THIS POINT REP. OTIS PIKE, (Den.Y.), BRANDISHING THE AXE WITH WHICH HE HAS BEEN PLAILING AWAY AT THE CIA, STEPPED IN. THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SO-CALLED HOUSE IN-TELLIGENCE COMMITTEE DEMANDED THAT THE PROTOCOLS BE PUT IN THE OFFICIAL RECORD. THIS WAS TO COMPOUND THE DAMAGE.

8. WHAT HAPPENED NEXT PUT INTO EVEN SHARPER RELIEF THE INTERNECINE WAR BETHEEN CONGRESS AND EXECUTIVE. PIKE HAULED BEFORE HIS COMMITTEE A JUNIOR STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICER AND DEMANDED THAT HE PRODUCE RECORDS OF HIS OPINION EXPRESSED AT THE TIME OF HOW KISSINGER HAD BUNGLED THE CYPRUS AFFAIR. THIS WAS CALCULATED TO UNDERMINE COMPLETELY THE PRIVACY OF DIPLOMATIC EXCHANGE AND THE INTEGRITY OF AN OFFICER WHO MIGHT FIND HIMSELF IN DIS-AGREEMENT WITH HIS SUPERIOR.

9. KISSINGER DECLINED TO ALLOW THE DOCUMENTS TO BE PUT BEFORE THE PIKE COMMITTEE. THE THREAT, STILL UNRESOLVED, WAS CONTEMPT OF CONGRESS, PARTLY THIS STEMS FROM THE CONVICTION OF PARTISANS OF GREECE THAT KISSINGER MIGHT HAVE PREVENTED THE TURKISH INVASION OF CYPRUS WITH ITS DISASTROUS RESULTS.

10. THAT IS, OF COURSE, HISTORY EXPLOITED BY THOSE WHO WOULD BRING KISSINGER DOWN. OF URGENT AND IMMINENT CONCERN IS THE ROLE OF SADAT AND THE CRUCIAL NATURE OF WIS PART IN THE FIRST-STEP DISENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT.



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11. AS THOUGH OFFICIAL DISCLOSURE OF THE PROTOCOLS WAS

UNCLASSIFIED NOT ENOUGH, ANOTHER DOCUMENT REVEALED THAT THE UNITED STATES HAD BROKEN EGYPT'S DIPLOMATIC CODE. SADAT WAS FURIOUS. IT COULD NOT BE RULED OUT THAT HE WOULD REPUDIATE THE AGREEMENT AND THE STRUCTURE PUT TOGETHER WITH SO MUCH EFFORT WOULD COME TUMBLING DOWN.

12. HIS ARAB ADVERSARIES, NOTABLY SYRIA AND THE PALESTINE LIBERATION ORGANIZATION, STEPPED UP THEIR ATTACKS. THEY WILL GROW MORE SHRILL AND VENGEFUL AS THE EGYPTIAN PRESIDENT COMES TO HASHINGTON THIS WEEK ON A STATE VISIT, THAT VISIT, IN LIGHT OF THE EXCELLENT WORKING RELATIONSHIP BETHEEN PRESIDENT FORD AND PRESIDENT SADAT AT SALZBURG LAST SUMMER, CAN REPAIR SOME OF THE DAMAGE.

13. AMORAL IS THE MILDEST OF THE EXPLETIVES THAT KISSINGER'S ENEMIES DIRECT AT HIM. HE PLAYS BIG-POHER, PERSONAL DIPLOMACY IN THE TRADITION OF METTERNICH WITH UNPARALLELED ARROGANCE, SO GOES THE CHARGE. THERE IS GRUMBLING WITHIN THE STATE DEPARTMENT, AS WELL, COMING FROM FOREIGN SERVICE OFFICERS HHO FEEL THAT THE SECRETARY DOES NOT TAKE INTO ACCOUNT THEIR EXPERTISE.

14. GRANTED THAT THE CHARGES ARE WITHOUT EXCEPTION CORRECT, WHICH I CERTAINLY DO NOT, CONSIDER THE REALITY OF THE NEXT 15 MONTHS.

15. SHORT OF AN ACCIDENT OR AN ABRUPT REVERSAL OF POSITION BY THE WHITE HOUSE, KISSINGER WILL BE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THAT TIME. FOR THIRTY YEARS, FROM THE ATOM BOMB TO THE MIRV MULTIPLE HARHEAD, AMERICAN INVENTIVE GENIUS HAS SOUGHT IN-CREASED SECURITY FOR THE COUNTRY THROUGH A SERIES OF TECH-NOLOGICAL MARVELS THAT, WHEN INEVITABLY ACQUIRED BY THE SOVIET UNION, HAVE HEIGHTENED THE NATION'S DANGER. LATEST, THE CRUISE MISSILE, HAS YET TO BE PLIGHT - TESTED. "JOKE-FILLED, HUFFING AND-PUFFING" MARCH UP FRAGRANT HILLS PRECEDED EVENING MEETINGS.

MHAK, IN HIS MEETING WITH CHAIRMAN MAD WAS ACCOMPANIED BY SEVEN OF HIS AIDES AND MRS, KISSINGER. THEY WERE ALL INTRODUCED TO THE CHAIRMAN. THO OF SECRETARY AIDES REMAINED BEHIND TO JOIN HAK IN HIS TALKS WITH CHAIRMAN MAD.

THE SECRETARY'S MISSION TO PEKING INCLUDES FIXING A DATE FOR PRESIDENT FORD'S VISIT TO CHINA WHICH IS EXPECTED SHORTLY AFTER THANKSGIVING .

CBS MORNING NEWS: "LOOKING OUT OF A HOTEL WINDOW IN CHINESE CAPITAL OFFERS A RECTANGLE OF LIFE IN PEKING. STREETS CROWDED WITH PEOPLE -- MEN AND WOMEN IN THEIR UNISEX BLUE OR GREY TUNIC AND TROUSERS. OCCASIONALLY SIGHT OF A MOVING LINE OF COLORS -- COLORS IN THREE SHADES! REDS, GREENS, WHITES. UP CLOSE IT TURNS OUT TO BE A KINDER-GARTEN CLASS. PRECOLLECTIONS COME TO MIND OF TOURIST BOOKS WRITTEN ONLY A HALP CENTURY AGO ABOUT PEKING. OF CAMELS STROLLING THROUGH THESE STREETS.

THE MOST IMPORTANT AMERICAN TOURIST IN TOWN THESE DAYS IS SECRETARY KISSINGER. HE'S HERE NOW ON HIS EIGHTH TRIP SINCE THAT CELEBRATED SECRET JOURNEY IN 1971. BUT NOW HE'S EMINENTLY VISIBLE NEGOTIATING WITH CHINA'S LEADERS ABOUT PRESIDENT FORD'S FORTHCOMING TRIP HERE EXPECTED SHORTLY AFTER THANKSGIVING. BUT THEY ARE ALSO EXPECTED TO



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TALK A BROAD RANGE OF ITEMS INCLUDING TAIWAN, TENSIONS ON KOREAN PENINSULA, U. S. POLICY IN ASIA, SOVIET POLICY.
BUT THROUGH IT ALL THERE IS CENTRAL QUESTION OF HOW BOTH SIDES NOW PERCEIVE EACH OTHER.

"TO U.S., CHINA IS PREDCCUPIED WITH ITS ANXIETIES ABOUT SOVIET UNION. TO CHINA, A BASIC QUESTION IS WHETHER AMERICA'S COMMITMENT TO MAINTAINING A WORLD BALANCE OF POWER HAS NOT BEEN EFFECTED BY THE U.S.! HUMILIATING SCRAMBLE OUT OF VIETNAM, WHEN CONGRESS! DETERMINATION TO PLAY A GREATER ROLE IS SHAPING FOREIGN POLICY.

"CONSTANCY IS NOT SOMETHING THAT HAK CAN SELL TO CHINESE, SELL THEM THAT THE U.S. IS NOT A PAPER TIGER, FOR EXAMPLE; THAT IT MEANS TO STICK BY ITS COMMITMENTS. ALL CHINESE HAVE TO DO TO GET ANSWER IS TO STUDY WASHINGTON'S INTERNATIONAL POSTURE. LOOK AT FACTS AROUND THE WORLD AND REACH THEIR OWN CONCLUSIONS.

"BASIC QUESTION SO FAR AS THEY'RE CONCERNED IS WHETHER U.S. HAS WILL AND DETERMINATION TO STAND UP AGAINST RUSSIANS, SINCE CHINESE SEE THEMSELVES AS BEING BENEFICIARIES OF SUCH AN AMERICAN STANCE. ONLY MAJOR ALTERNATIVE THAT CHINESE HAVE IS SOME SORT OF RECONCILIATION WITH RUSSIANS. AND THOUGH THERE ARE SOME WESTERN ANALYSTS WHO BELIEVE THAT THERE IS SUCH A MINORITY ELEMENT IN CHINESE HIERARCHY, IT DOES NOT SEEM TO BE IN CARDS, CERTAINLY NOT AS LONG AS CHAIRMAN MAD IS ON THE SCENE.

"THIS COMPLICATED QUESTION WITH ALL ITS IMPLICATIONS FOR WORLD COULD, OF COURSE, COME UP WHEN THERE'S A COMPLETE GENERATIONAL CHANGE IN CHINESE LEADERSHIP. BUT RIGHT NOW MEN RUNNING CHINA RUN IT ESSENTIALLY FROM MAD'S POINT OF VIEW, WHICH MEANS A CONNECTION WITH U.S. AS A COUNTER WEIGHT AGAINST MOSCOW.

MOST OF TIME, AS HISTORY TELLS US, IT IS NOT PERSONALITIES BUT NATIONAL INTERESTS THAT DETERMINE POLICY. AND GIVEN BOTH WASHINGTON'S AND PEKING'S WARINESS OF SOVIET POHER AND SOVIET INFLUENCE, HAK BELIEVES THAT CHINESE AMERICAN CONNECTION IS A FACT OF PUTURE. " INGERSOLL BT

SUBJECT: JAPAN-UNITED STATES PRIENDSHIP ACT: PRESS GUIDANCE AND TEXT OF WHITE HOUSE STATEMENT

FOLLOWING GUIDANCE PREPARED FOR DEPARTMENT'S USE IN RESPONDING TO QUESTIONS FROM THE PRESS. WHITE HOUSE RELEASE ON SIGNING OF FRIENDSHIP ACT ALSO TRANSMITTED BELOW FOR POSTIS USE. FINAL TEXT OF FRIENDSHIP ACT AND CONFERENCE REPORT SENT TO MCDONALD FROM BALL TEN DAYS AGO. ADVISE IF NOT RECEIVED.

PRESS GUIDANCE G'S AND A'S FOLLOWS:

1. Q - HE UNDERSTAND THE PRESIDENT HAS SIGNED THE JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP ACT'. HAS THERE A STATEMENT?

A. THE PRESIDENT DID SIGN THE ACT. THERE IS A STATEMENT. THE SIGNING OF THE PRIENDSHIP ACT IS THE CULMINATION OF EFFORTS BY THE CONGRESS AND THE ADMINISTRATION OVER THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS TO CREATE A FUND FOR EXPANDED CULTURAL ACTIVITIES BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES. THE ACT ESTABLISHES A FUND TO SUPPORT THESE ACTIVITIES OUT OF MONIES THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT HAS PAID OR IS PAYING TO THE UNITED STATES. THE FUND WILL BE ADMINISTERED BY A

JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP COMMISSION, CONSISTING OF MEMBERS OF THE U.S. PANEL OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON UNITED STATES-JAPAN CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL COOPERA-TION, PLUS THE CHAIRMEN OF THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT OF THE



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ARTS AND THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT OF THE HUMANITIES. MEMBERS OF EACH HOUSE OF THE CONGRESS HILL SERVE IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY.

THE ACT WAS FIRST INTRODUCED IN THE SENATE BY SENATOR JACOB JAVITS OF NEW YORK, WITH NUMEROUS CO-SPONSORS. IN THE HOUSE, REPRESENTATIVE WAYNE HAYS OF OHIO WAS THE PRINCIPAL SPONSOR. THE ACT, TOGETHER WITH THE CON-FERENCE REPORT. WAS PRINTED IN THE CONGRESSIONAL RECORD OF OCTOBER 2, PAGE H 9480.

WE ARE PLEASED THAT THIS NEW FUND HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED. IT WILL CERTAINLY FURTHER BOTH COUNTRY'S OBJECTIVE OF DEEPENING UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES, THROUGH EXPANDED CULTURAL ACTIVITY HERE AND IN JAPAN.

2. Q - HOW MUCH MONEY IS INVOLVED?

A. THE FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER THE ACT AUTHORIZES THE APPROPRIATION OF REMAINING GARIDA (GOVERNMENT AND ASSISTANCE IN OCCUPIED AREAS) FUNDS SET ASIDE BY A 1962 AGREEMENT WITH JAPAN FOR CULTURAL PURPOSES. WE ESTIMATE THAT THESE FUNDS NOW TOTAL ABOUT 12 MILLION DOLLARS IN YEN, IN TREASURY ACCOUNTS IN JAPAN. THE ACT ALSO SETS ASIDE THE EQUIVALENT OF 7.5 PERCENT OF THE DOLS 320 MILLION THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN IS PAYING THE UNITED STATES IN CONNECTION WITH THE OKINAWA REVERSION AGREE-MENT. THIS AMOUNTS TO A TOTAL OF 24 MILLION DOLLARS. THE PUNDS OF COURSE MUST BE APPROPRIATED BY THE CONGRESS BEFORE THEY WILL BE AVAILABLE UNDER THIS ACT.

3. Q- HAVE YOU A LIST OF THE MEMBERS OF COMMISSION?

A. I HAVE A LIST OF THE AMERICAN PANEL OF THE JOINT COM-MITTEE ON CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL COOPERATION. JOHN HALL OF YALE IS THE CHAIRMAN, AND HE WILL BE CHAIRMAN OF THE FRIENDSHIP COMMISSION TOO.

4. Q - HAVE THE JAPANESE BEEN NOTIFIED OF THIS ACT?

A. YES.

5. Q - CAN YOU TELL US WHAT KIND OF PROJECTS COULD BE SUPPORTED UNDER THE ACT? WILL THIS MONEY BE SPEND MOSTLY



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IN THE U.S. OR IN JAPAN?

A. I URGE YOU TO READ THE ACT - A COPY OF WHICH I HAVE HERE. I ASSUME THE COMMISSION WILL DECIDE HOW THE MONEY WILL BE USED! BUT CERTAINLY IT IS TO SUPPORT CULTURAL ACTIVITIES HERE AND IN JAPAN.

NOTICE TO THE PRESS

THE PRESIDENT HAS SIGNED S. 824-JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP ACT -- WHICH WILL ESTABLISH A JAPAN-UNITED STATES PRIENDSHIP TRUST FUND AND A JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP COMMISSION TO DEVELOP AND CARRY OUT PROGRAMS TO PROMOTE SCHOLARLY, CULTURAL, AND ARTISTIC ACTIVITIES BETHEEN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES.

THE BILL WILL ESTABLISH AN INCOME-EARNING TRUST FUND IN THE TREASURY CALLED THE JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP TRUST PUND. AMOUNTS IN THE FUND WILL BE USED TO ASSIST A VARIETY OF ACTIVITIES CONSISTENT WITH THE BILL'S PURPOSE INCLUDING SUPPORT FOR: (1) STUDIES AND RESEARCH IN JAPA-NESE AND U.S. INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION: (2) MAJOR BOOK COLLECTIONS IN JAPANESE AND U.S. LIBRARIES; (3) PRO-GRAMS IN THE ARTS IN ASSOCIATION WITH JAPANESE AND U.S. INSTITUTIONS; (4) GRADUATE AND FACULTY-LEVEL FELLOWSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS IN JAPAN AND THE UNITED STATES; AND (5) VISITING PROFESSORS AND LECTURERS IN JAPANESE AND U.S. UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES.

S. 824 WILL AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATION TO THE FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR 1976 OF APPROXIMATELY DOLS 36 MILLION. THIS TOTAL CONSISTS OF AN AMOUNT EQUIVALENT TO 7.5 PERCENT OF THE FUNDS PAYABLE BY JAPAN TO THE UNITED STATES UNDER THE TERMS OF THE 1971 OKINAWA REVERSION AGREEMENT (DOLS 24 MILLION) AND APPROXIMATELY DOLS 12 MILLION OF JAPANESE CURRENCY REMAINING IN CERTAIN U.S. ACCOUNTS IN JAPAN (G.A-R.I.O.A.) STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

ALMOST A YEAR AGO, I HAD THE GREAT HONOR AND PLEASURE TO BE THE FIRST AMERICAN PRESIDENT IN OFFICE TO VISIT JAPAN, MY TRIP CONVINCED ME MORE THAN EVER THAT WE AMERICANS CAN LEARN MUCH FROM JAPAN'S CULTURE WHICH WILL ENRICH THE GUALITY OF OUR LIVES.

ONE WEEK ASO THE EMPEROR AND EMPRESS OF JAPAN COMPLETED A VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES, THE FIRST SUCH VISIT IN HISTORY.

THIS EXCHANGE OF STATE VISITS NOT ONLY SYMBOLIZES THE IMPORTANCE OF OUR RELATIONS BUT ALSO THE VALUE OF THE EXP CHANGE OF PEOPLE AND IDEAS BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

SEVERAL YEARS AGO, THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN ESTABLISHED A FOUNDATION TO EXPAND UNDERSTANDING OF JAPAN AHONG UNIVER-SITIES AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS IN THE UNITED STATES AND ELSENHERE IN THE WORLD. THROUGH THE FOUNDATION, THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN MADE A GENEROUS GIFT TO TEN AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES TO STRENGTHEN THE STUDY OF JAPANESE HISTORY AND CULTURE. AND THIS YEAR, THE GOVERNMENT OF JAPAN ANNOUNCED THE SIFT OF AN EXPERIMENTAL THEATER TO THE KENNEDY CENTER FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS, AS A BICENTENNIAL PRESENT TO THE PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES.

NOW IT IS OUR TURN. THE PEOPLE OF AMERICA GENUINELY DESIRE TO BUILD CLOSER RELATIONS WITH THE PEOPLE OF JAPAN. THIS REQUIRES THAT HE UNDERSTAND EACH OTHER'S ARTS, SOCIETY AND HISTORY MORE WIDELY AND MORE DEEPLY.

IT WAS MY PLEASURE TO SIGN INTO LAW AN ACT WHICH WILL EFFECTIVELY FURTHER THIS IMPORTANT GOAL. THROUGH THE DISTINGUISHED LEADERSHIP OF SENATOR JACOB JAVITS AND CONGRESSMAN WAYNE HAYS AND MANY OTHERS IN BOTH HOUSES, THE JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP ACT IS NOW THE LAW OF THE LAND.

THE ACT PROVIDES FOR THE CREATION OF A JAPAN-UNITED STATES FRIENDSHIP COMMISSION TO ADMINISTER A PROGRAM OF EXPANDED SCHOLARLY, CULTURAL, AND ARTISTIC VENTURES BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES. THE COMMISSION WILL BE COMPOSED OF THE 12 MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES PANEL OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE

ON UNITED STATES JAPAN CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL COOPERA-



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TION; THE CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE ARTS; THE CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR THE HUMANITIES; TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER; AND TWO MEMBERS OF THE SENATE TO BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE.

BECAUSE OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISION AGAINST MEMBERS OF THE CONGRESS SERVING IN ANY OTHER OFFICE OF THE UNITED STATES, THE CONGRESSIONAL MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION WILL SERVE IN AN ADVISORY CAPACITY, AS NON-VOTING MEMBERS.

I AM CONFIDENT THAT THE SUPPORT MADE AVAILABLE UNDER THE ACT FOR EXPANDED CULTURAL RELATIONS WILL CONTRIBUTE IMPORTANTLY TO THE STRENGTHENING OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE PEOPLE OF JAPAN. (END OF STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT) INGERSOLL BT

KON READ A COPY OF MFAIS TELEGRAM TO AMBASSADOR ANAN WHICH MENTIONED THAT CHATCHAI WAS BUSY "CLEARING UP SOME DIFFICULTIES WITH NEIGHBORING COUNTRIE. . # THE NATION OF OCTOBER 21 REPORTED CHATCHAI HAD DELAYED TRIP TO U.S., AND VOA OCT. 21 CARRIED SIMILAR STORY.

2. CAUSE OF CHANGE IN CHATCHAI'S PLANS BECAME APPARENT LATER ON OCT. 21 WHEN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS SPOKESMAN, NITSAI HETCHACHINA, ANNOUNCED THAT FOREIGN MINISTER HAD RECEIVED CABLE FROM AMBASSADOR ANAN SAYING THAT CAMBODIAN DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER IENG SARY WOULD ARRIVE IN BANGKOK OCT. 28 AND REMAIN UNTIL NOV. 1. IENG SARY WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY TWO OR THREE OTHER PEOPLE, BUT NAMES NOT YET AVAILABLE.

COMMENT: RTG HAS LONG AND PATIENTLY SOUGHT TO IMPROVE ITS RELATIONS WITH ITS COMMUNIST NEIGHBORS, AND IN THIS LIGHT IT IS LOGICAL THAT CHATCHAI WOULD POSTPONE TRIP TO WASHINGTON TO BE PRESENT FOR VISIT TO BANGKOK OF IENG SARY. SUBJECT: UPDATE OF JAPAN BRIEFING BOOK - PREPCON II

BACKGROUND - THE JAPANESE CAME TO PREPCON II ANXIOUS TO AVOID ANOTHER FAILURE AND ANY DRIFT TOWARD CONFRONTATION WITH THE OIL PRODUCERS. THEY APPRECIATED THE LEAD POSITION WE HAD TAKEN IN WORKING OUT A CONSENSUS WHICH PROVIDED A BASIS FOR RENEWING THE DIALOGUE AND IN WORKING WITH THE GROUP OF SEVEN IN PARIS TO ACHIEVE AN ACCEPTABLE COMPROMISE ON ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES FOR THE FOUR COMMISSIONS. WERE PARTICULARLY PLEASED AT OUR EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN CLOSE AND CONTINUOUS COORDINATION WITH THEM AND THE EC DURING THE MEETING AND INDICATED PLAINLY THEIR READINESS TO FOLLOW THE US LEAD.

THE PRIMARY JAPANESE CONCERNS WERE TO ENSURE THE FOUR COMMISSIONS HERE GIVEN EQUAL IMPORTANCE, TO PRESERVE THE FLEXIBILITY OF THE COMMISSIONS IN DECIDING HOW TO HANDLE SUBSTANTIVE WORK AND TO MAINTAIN SOLIDARITY WITH THE US AND EC WITHOUT ANTAGONIZING THE OPECYLOC BLOC. THEY RECOGNIZE THE DIALOGUE IS UNLIKELY TO CONTRIBUTE MUCH TOWARD MODER-ATION OF OPEC PRICE DEMANDS AND WERE THUS NOT TOO CONCERNED ABOUT THE SHIFT IN THE FOCUS OF THE DIALOGUE AWAY PROM ENERGY. JAPAN RECOGNIZES THE VITAL INTERESTS THEY HAVE AT

STAKE IN THIS PROCESS, PARTICULARLY IN RAW MATERIALS WHERE THEY HAVE EXPRESSED TENTATIVE INTEREST IN BEING THE INDUSTRIALIZED COUNTRY CO-CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMISSION. WHILE THEY WISH TO BECOME MORE VISIBLE, THEY REMAIN RE-LUCTANT TO ASSERT THEIR MAJOR POWER STATUS AT THIS EARLY
