1. ON THE MORNING OF OCTOBER 22, MFA SECGEN ELEKDAG CALLED ME TO HIS OFFICE IN ORDER TO GIVE ME THE FOLLOWING REPLY PROM PRIMIN DEMIREL TO PRESIDENT FORD. ELEKDAG APOLOGIZED FOR DELAY IN PREPARATION OF THIS RESPONSE BUT SAID THAT THIS WAS BECAUSE THE PRIMIN HAD WORKED ON IT PERSONALLY.

2. AFTER HANDING ME PRIMIN'S MESSAGE, ELEKDAG TURNED CONVERSATION TO FORTHCOMING US-TURK NEGOTIATIONS OF REVISED DEFENSE COOPERATION AGREEMENT. (HIS REMARKS BEING REPORTED SEPTEL.) DEMIREL'S MESSAGE TO PRESIDENT FORD FOLLOWS: BEGIN MESSAGE: DEAR MR. PRESIDENT: AMBASSADOR MACOMBER HAS CONVEYED TO ME YOUR MESSAGES OF OCTOBER 3RD AND OCTOBER 15TH, 1975. I AGREE WITH YOU ON THE NEED TO WORK TO REVITALIZE OUR SECURITY RELATIONSHIP AND TO ACHIEVE PROGRESS TOWARD A CYPRUS STTLEMENT. NO DOUBT THE RECENT DECISION OF THE CONGRESS ON ARMS SUPPLY (#) A POSITIVE FIRST STEP

TOWARD THE RESTORATION OF OUR MUTUAL SECURITY RELATIONSHIP. BUT I WOULD BE LESS THAN FRANK IF I DID NOT EMPHASIZE HERE THE DISAPPOINTMENT FELT IN TURKEY OVER THE SERIOUSLIMITATIONS AND CONDITIONS CONTAINED IN THIS RESOLUTION UNDER WHICH TURKEY

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STILL CONTINUES TO BE SUBJECT OF DISCRIMINATION NOT ONLY AMONG THE ALLIES OF THE UNITED STATES BUT ALSO AMONG SOME COUNTRIES WITH WHOM YOOR COUNTRY HAS NO ALLIANCE RELATIONSHIP. HOWEVER, THIS DOES NOT, IN ANY WAY, AFFECT OUR FEELINGS OF APPRECIATION FOR THE VALUABLE EFFORTS THAT YOU, MR. PRESIDENT, YOUR ADMINISTRATION AND THOSE WHO SUPPORTED OUR CASE IN THE CONGRESS HAVE DEPLOYED TO REMEDY THE UNFORTUNATE SITUATION CREATED BY THE CONGRESS DICISION OF FEBRUARY 5TH, 1975. YOU ARE AWARE OF THE GREAT VALUE WE ATTACH TO OUR FRIENDSHIP AND CLOSE SOOPERATION WITH THE UNITED STATES AND OF OUR VERY SINCERE DESIRE TO REVITALIZE THEM. I KNOW THAT THIS FEELING IS RECIPROCATED BY THE UNITED STATES, THEREFORE, I BELIEVE THAT THE TASK AMEAD OF US IS TO WORK OUT FOR OUR BILATERAL DEFENCE COOPERATION A STABLE CONCEPT WHICH WILL REFLECT A SOUND BALANCE BETWEEN OUR MUTUAL OBLIGATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES AND WHICH WILL BE IMMUNE FROM ANY INTER-VENTION INCONSISTENT WITH OUR MUTUAL INTERESTS AND THE FRIENDLY FEELINGS THAT BOTH NATIONS HAVE FOR EACH OTHER. IT IS WITH THIS SINCERE BELIEF THAT THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT, DESIPTE THE SERIOUS SHORTCOMINGS OF THE RECENT DECISION OF THE CONGRESS, HAS DECIDED TO RESUME NEGOTIATIONS TO WORK OUT ARRANGEMENTS FOR OUR FUTURE BILATERAL DEFENCE COOPERATIONS. OUR DETERMINED AIM WOULD BE TO COME TO A RAPID AGREEMENT SO THAT OUR MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL COOPERATIONS COULD BE RESUMED WITHOUT DELAY, HE BELIEVE THAT OUR RESUMED COOPERATION WILL BE MORE STABLE AND DURABLE IF BEFOREHAND UNCERTAINTIES AND DOUBTS COULD BE REMOVED AND A SOUND CONCEPT COULD BE WORKED OUT. AN EARLY RESUMPTION ON AN UNSTABLE BASIS WILL, IN MY BIEW, BE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE FOR A MORE STABLE FUTURE RELATIONSHIP WHICH WE ALL SINCERELY DESIRE TO ACHIEVE. MR. PRESIDENT, YOU WILL REMEMBER THAT DURING THE MEETINGS WHICH WE HAD IN BRUSSELS AND IN HELSINKI, I HAD STRESSED THAT WE SHOULD REFRAIN FROM INJECTPNG INTO OUR RELATIONS THE COMPLEXITY AND THE MALAISE OF ISSUES SUCH AS THE CYPRUS PROBLEM OR THE TURKISH-GREEK DISPUTE AND THAT THE REGRETTABLE ATTITUDE OF THE U.S. CONGRESS TO LINK THE PROBLEM OF CYPRUS WITH THE TURKISH-AMERICAN RELATIONS AS A WHOLE WOULD NOT ONLY BE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE, AS IT WOULD RENDER MORE DIFFICULT THE ENDEAVOURS FOR A NEGOTIATED SOLUTION OF THIS PROBLEM, BUT ALSO CAUSE UNDUE HARM TO OUR RELATIONS. I AM CONVINCED TODAY MORE THAN EVER THAT FIRST TO REVITALIZE OUR RELATIONS AND THEN TO MAINTAIN THEM INTACT, BOTH THE UNITED STATES AND TURKEY SHOULD DISPLAY UTMOST CARE NOT TO IMMIX IN THESE RELATIONS ISSUES ALIEN TO THEIR REAL CONTEXT. THIS BEING OUR STAND, NOW I WOULD LIKE TO INFORM YOU ABOUT THE VIEWS OF THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT IN THE CYPRUS QUESTION FOR ACHIEVING PROGRESS TOWARDS ITS SETTLEMENT. AS IS KNOWN TURKEY HAS MADE PUBLIC VIEWS CONCERNING



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A VIABLE POLITICAL SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM, THE BITTER EXPERIENCES OF THE TURKISH CYPRIOT COMMUNITY IN THE LAST TWELVE YEARS HAVE STRONGLY DICTATED THE CONDITIONS OF SUCH A SOLUTION WHICH ARE A BI-ZONAL FEDERAL STATE WITH LIMITED POWERS FOR THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT AND PARTICIPATION IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT OF BOTH COMMUNITIES ON AN EQUAL FOOTING. WITHIN THIS FRAMERORK, THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT IS READY TO ENCOURAGE THE TURKISH CYPRIOT SIDE IN THE INTER\*COMMUNAL TALKS TO NEGOTIATE WITH THE GREEK CYPRIOT COMMUNITY THE SETTING UP OF THE FEDERAL STATE ALONG THE ABOVE MENTIONED PRINCIPLES SIMULTANEOUSLY WITH THE BORDER REARRANGEMENTS. IN THIS RESPECT I HOULD LIKE TO ASSURE YOU, MR. ELEKDAG SAID HE WISHED TO COMMENT AGAIN ON USG CONCERNS OVER INDEFINITE PROLONGATION OF SUSPENSION OF ACTIVITIES ON COMMON DEFENSE INSTALLATIONS (CDIIS) HERE, HE SAID THAT GOT UNDERSTOOD ADMINISTRATIVE, FINANCIAL AND PRACTICAL PROBLEMS THAT CONTINUED IDLENESS PRESENTED FOR US. I INTER-RUPTED TO SAY THAT I WAS NOT EARLIER SUGGESTING THAT WE WOULD SUDDENLY BEGIN REMOVING OUR PEOPLE IN DISILLUSIONMENT OR AS A MATTER OF PIQUE, BUT ONLY THAT INEVITABLE PERSONNEL ATTRITION AND FINANCIAL INHIBITIONS HOULD OVER ANY SUSTAINED PERIOD OF TIME ALMOST CERTAINLY RESULT IN WHAT IN EFFECT WOULD BE A YERY SUBSTANTIAL EVACUATION OF THESE BASES BY US PERSONNEL. AGREEMENT SETTLED WITHIN SIX WEEKS. NEVERTHELESS, HE ASSURED
ME, THIS WAS THE GOT OBJECTIVE AND WOULD BE HIS OBJECTIVE AS:
THE CHIEF GOT NEGOTIATOR. HE SAID, "IN THE PACKEGE WE PRESENT

QOMMENT: I BELIEVE SOME TURK OFFICIALS ARE NOW SOMEWHAT CONCERNED OVER THE EFFECT ON USG OFFICIALS OF THE GOT FAILURE EVEN PARTIALLY TO LIFT THE SUSPENSION OF ACTIVITIES ON THE CDI'S IN THE WAKE OF THE RECENT CONGRESSIONAL VOTE. WHETHER THIS GOT CONCERN WILL HAVE A MITIGATING EFFECT ON THE TURK NEGOTIATING POSITION IN THE FORTHCOMING TALKS REMAINS TO BE SEEN. I REMAIN SKEPTICAL, HOWEVER, THAT AGREEMENT CAN BE REACHED ON THE BASIC ELEMENTS OF A NEW NEGOTIATION (THE GOT CONDITION PRECENDENT FOR THE REACTIVATION OF THE CDI'S) IN SIX WEEKS TIME. A BETTER JUDGMENT ON THIS, HOWEVER, CAN OBVOUSLY BE MADE AFTER WE SEE THE PROPOSAL PRESENTED NEXT TUESDAY.

1. GALLAGHER PICKED UP FAKHOURY AND MARGO ZILIFIAN, BOTH RSC EMPLOYEES, IN FRONT OF THE SQUAD 16 (POLICE) HO ON CORNICHE MAZRAA AT APPROXIMATELY 0630 HR ON 22 OCTOBER 1975. AT APPROXIMATELY 0640 THE CAR WITH FOUR PEOPLE WAS JUST CROSSING RUE OMAR EL KHATTAB WHEN A MAN YELLED "STOP" IN ARABIC. THERE WAS ONLY ONE MAN ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE ROAD. THERE WERE 4-5 ARMED MEN ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE ROAD BESIDE A LITTLE SHACK ON THE CORNER OF RUE BILAL 62 AND CORNICHE MAZRAA. THE LATTER WAS NOT OBSERVED AT THIS TIME. GALLAGHER AND DYKES DO NOT SPEAK ARABIC. BOTH MEN WERE

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SEATED IN THE FRONTAND GALLAGHER WAS DRIVING. HE APPARENTLY HEARD THE MAN YELL BECAUSE HE SLOWED DOWN BUT DID NOT COME TO A COMPLETE STOP. AGAIN THE MAN YELLED "HALT" IN ARABIC AND WAS READY TO FIRE. HE WAS ARMED WITH AK-47 ASSAULT RIFLE. OF THE THO HOMAN EMPLOYEES OF RSC ONLY MARGO ZILIFIAN COULD SPEAK ENGLISH AND SHE TRANSLATED THE MAN'S CALL TO HALT, WHICH GALLAGHER DID.

2. HITH THE CAR HALTED IN THE EAST BOUND LANE OF CORNICHE MAZRAA THE ARMED MAN CAME AND LOOKED AT THE CD 104 LICENSE PLATES IN FRONT AND REAR AND WALKED OVER TO GALLAGHER. GALLAGHER SPOKE TO THE MAN IN ENGLISH. THE MAN LOOKED ACROSS GALLAGHER TO THE HOMEN AND ASKED, "WHERE ARE YOU GOING?" PAKHOURY REPLIED "THERE", INDICATING THE GENERAL DIRECTION OF EAST, GALLAGHER ATTEMPTED TO PULL OUT HIS FOREIGN MINISTRY ID CARD AND AS HE EXTRACTED THE CARD THE ARMED MAN OPENED GALLAGHER'S CAR DOOR AND TOOK THE ID CARD. AT THIS POINT, THE MAN SEEMED YERY PLEASED SAYING, "AN AMERICAN -- WITH THE AMERICAN EMBASSY. VERY GOOD.

3. THE ARMED MAN THEN MOTIONED GALLAGHER AND DYKES TO GET OUT OF THE CAR AND TOLD THE HOMEN TO GET OUT OF THE VEHICLE. THEY ALL ASSEMBLED ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE CORNICHE. GALLAGHER AND DYKES HERE DIRECTED BY WAVES WITH THE AK-47 RIFLE. AGAIN THE MAN ASKED, "WHERE ARE YOU GOING?# FAKHOURY, AT THIS POINT, NOT WISHING TO REVEAL HER CONNECTION WITH THE AMERICANS, AND THEREBY PERHAPS RETAIN HER PREEDOM TO REPORT THE INCIDENT, ADVISED THAT SHE AND ZILIFIAN WERE ENROUTE TO THE PALACE OF JUSTICE WHICH IS ON TRNICHE, JUST DOWN FROM WHERE THEY WERE STOPPED. THE ARMED MAN ASKED WHERE THE MEN WERE GOING. FAKHOURY REPLIED THAT SHE DID NOT KNOW. THE ARMED MAN ASKED HOW IT WAS THAT THEY WERE IN THE CAR WITH THE AMERICANS IF THE WOMEN DID NOT KNOW WHERE THEY WERE GOING? FAKHOURY RESPONDED THAT SHE AND ZILIFIAN WERE WAITING FOR A SERVICE TAXI WHEN GALLAGHER AND DYKES DROVE UP, AND OFFERED THEM A LIFT WHICH THEY ACCEPTED. THE ARMED MAN APPARENTLY BOUGHT THIS STORY, NOT THINKING IT REMARKABLE THAT THE WOMEN WERE SPEAKING ONLY IN ARABIC AND GALLAGHER WAS SPEAKING ONLY IN ENGLISH.



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4. THE ARMED MAN THEN DEMANDED THE ID CARD OF THE THO HOMEN, HE LOOKED THEM OVER AND MANDED THEM BACK. AS HE HANDED THE CARDS BACK HE TOLD THE HOMEN TO GO. THEY DID NOT GO. FAKHOURY APPROACHED THE ARMED MAN AND PUT HER HAND ON HIS ARM ASKING HIM TO LET THE AMERICANS GO. SHE ASKED FOR THE ARMED MAN'S NAME BUT HE DID NOT REPLY. THE ARMED MAN THEN TOLD THE WOMEN TO GO AND MOTIONED GALLAGHER AND DYKES AWAY FROM THEM, SEPARATING THEM INTO TWO GROUPS.

5. AT THIS POINT, GALLAGHER TURNED AS IF TO SPEAK TO ZILIFIAN BUT FAKHOURY MOTIONED TO GALLAGHER NOT TO TALK AND TRIED TO INDICATE THAT SHE HOULD TELEPHONE. FAKHOURY WAS NOT SURE WHETHER OR NOT GALLAGHER UNDERSTOOD, BUT HE MADE NO FURTHER EFFORTS TO COMMUNICATE. THE ARMED MAN AGAIN, VIROUROUSLY, TOLD FAKHOURY AND ZILIFIAN TO LEAVE, THEN CALLED THEM BACK TO LOOK AGAIN AT THE ADRESSES ON THE ID CARDS BOTH ZILIFIAN AND FAKHOURY LIVE IN THE MAZRAA AREA AND THEIR ID CARDS SO INDICATED, HE ALSO TOLD THEM, " YOU HEARD NOTHING YOU SAW NOTHING#.

6. THE MAN AGAIN TOLD THEM TO GO, AND THIS TPME THEY DID. THEY CROSSED RUE OMAR EL KHATTAB, THEN CUT ACROSS THE MEDIAN STRIP TO THE HOSPITAL. AS THEY WERE LEAVING, ONE OF THE ARMED MEN WHO WAS STANDING BY A LITTLE SHACK ON THE CORNER OF RUE BILAL 62 CAME OVER TO JOIN THE FIRST MAN, THE FIRST MAN MUST HAVE NOTICED A GROUP OF PEOPLE BY THE HOSPITAL FOR THE FIRST TIME BECAUSE HE YELLED AT THEM TO GET BACK INSIDE, TO EMPHASIZE HIS POINT HE FIRED TWO BURST OF ROUNDS IN THEIR GENERAL DIRECTION. THE WOMEN WERE ON THE MEDIAN STRIP WHEN THE SHOTS WERE FIRED. 7 AT THE THO BURST OF RIFLE SHOTS, THE WOMEN RAN ACROSS THE STREET TO THE HOSPITAL AND STARTED WALKING WEST, AS SOON AS THEY GOT TO THE CORNER OF CORNICHE MAZRAA AND THE RUE BASTA, THE CAR WITH GALLAGHER AND DYKES IN THE BACK SEAT WAS SEEN TURNING FROM THE CORNICHE ON TO RUE BASTZ, HEADING NORTH, TOWARD THE BORJ. THE HOMEN THEN TOOK A SERVICE TO THEIR HOME AREA AND CALLED MR. EVANS RSC TO REPORT. GENERAL OBSERVATIONS:

- 1. AT NO TIME WERE ANY NAMES USED.
- 2. ONLY THE FIRST ARMED TALKED WITHIN THE HEARING OF SOURCE.
- 3. THERE WAS NO ROAD BLOCK, PER SE. THERE WERE 4-5 MEN ON THE NORTH SIDE (WEST BOUND LANE) NEAR A SMALL SHACK AT THE CORNER OF RUE BILAL 62 STANDING NEXT TO A SOLID GREEN LAND ROVER WITH A MACHINE GUN MOUNTED ON A PYLON IN THE BEB OF THE TRUCK. THE TRYCK WAS FACING NORTH, TOWARD THE SOUK AREAM NO LICENSE PLATE WAS OBSERVED THERE WAS THE ONE ARMED MAN ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF



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THE CORNICHE MAZRAA (EAST BOUND LANE). ALL WERE DRESSED IN THE SAME UNIFORM EXCEPT FOR ONE MAN WHO HORE A " KAPPUR" ON HIS HEAD. THE KAPPIR WAS WHITE WITH NAVY BLUE STRIPES AT EACH END.

4. ONLY ONE MAN COULD BE DESCRIBED WITH ANY ASSURANCE; THIS WAS THE MAN WHO STOOPED THE CAR AND DID THE TALKING MEIGHT: ABOUT 6 FEET WEIGHT: UNKNOWN, 140-150( 297,3 -83: YOUNG BUILD: VERY THIN DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS: NONE NATIONALUTY BY ACCENT THE MAN WAS LEBABSES.

THE WRITER OF THE FOLLOWING ARTICLE, A 37-YEAR-OLD HISTORIAN AND DISSIDENT, IS BEST KNOWN IN THE WEST FOR HIS BOOK "WILL THE USSR SURVIVE UNTIL 19847" IN WHICH HE POSTULATES THAT HOSTILITY AMONG VARIOUS ETHNIC GROUPS AND AN EVENTUAL WAR WITH CHINA COULD TEAR THE SOVIET UNION APART. LAST MAY, HE RETURNED TO MOSCOH AFTER FIVE YEARS! IMPRISONMENT AND INTERNAL EXILE ON CHARGES ARISING FROM HIS WRITINGS. BARRED FROM RESIDENCE IN MOSCOW LAST MONTH, HE NOW LIVES IN A NEARBY TOWN AND IS PERMITTED TO VISIT THE CITY THO AND THREE DAYS AT A TIME, THIS HAS TRANSLATED FROM THE RUSSIAN BY THE NEW YORK TIMES.

3 MOSCOW == ASSESSING THE ADVANTAGES OF DETENTER OVER THE COLD WAR, WE DON'T HAVE THE RIGHT, IT SEEMS, TO SAY THAT DETENTE IS THE ALTERNATIVE TO WAR. THE COLD WAR, BEING A FORM OF SUBLIMATION OF HOT WAR, WAS NOT LESS EFFECTIVE THAN "DETENTE" IN AVERTING A REAL WAR, BECAUSE PEACE DEPENDED, AND STILL DEPENDS, ON THE BALANCE OF NUCLEAR

POWER. THEREFORE, EVEN A MUTUAL REDUCTION OF WEAPONS, SHOULD IT EVER BE ACHIEVED, WOULD NOT REDUCE AND WOULD NOT INCREASE THE RISKS OF WAR.



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4. THE RISE IN ARMAMENTS IS A CONSEQUENCE OF CONFRONTA-TION, NOT ITS CAUSE, AND TO A CERTAIN DEGREE IS A CON-SEQUENCE OF SCIENTIFIC TECHNICAL PROGRESS, INASMUCH AS AN ACCORD ABOUT REDUCTIONS IN THESE OR THOSE AREAS WILL NOT END EITHER CONFRONTATION OR PROGRESS, THE ARMS RACE IF SUPPRESSED IN ONE AREA WILL MERELY EMERGE IN ANOTHER. A REDUCTION IN ARMS MAY BE A RESULT OF DETENTE BUT IT IS NOT ITS SOLE NOR BASIC CONTENT. THEREFORE, IT IS BETTER TO LOOK UPON DETENTE AS AN INSTRUMENT NOT FOR THE SAFEGUARD-ING OF PEACE BUT RATHER FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE WORLD. OTHERWISE, THERE WOULD BE NO SENSE IN DETENTE.

AN IMPRESSION IS GROWING, HOWEVER, THAT THE OBJECTIVE OF THE U.S. IN DETENTE IS PRECISELY THE SAPEGUARDING OF THE EXISTING SITUATION. IT SEEMS TO BE STRIVING TO ENTANGLE THE U.S.S.R. IN A HEB OF TREATIES AND MUTUAL COMMITMENTS, AND THEREBY DEPRIVE IT OF THE ABILITY TO DISRUPT WORLD STABILITY WITHOUT CONCERN THAT THESE TIES MIGHT RE SEVERED.

6. SOVIET UNION'S AIMS. FOR THE USSR, THE SIDE STILL ON THE OFFENSIVE, THE OBJECTIVES OF DETENTE ARE MUCH BROADER. THE USSR IS STRIVING TO EMERGE FROM ISOLATION FOR AT LEAST THREE REASONS: FIRST, TO USE DETENTE WITH THE WEST TO MANIPULATE THE WESTERN COUNTRIES ONE BY ONE RATHER THAN AS A GROUP, AND THIS IS ALREADY HAPPENING TO A CERTAIN EXTENT: SECOND, TO ASSURE ITSELF OF A SECURE REAR IN VIEW OF THE HOSTILE RELATIONS WITH CHINA; THIRD, TO OVERCOME THE ECONOMIC BACKWARDNESS DERIVING FROM THE ISOLATION.

7. DESPITE IMPORTANT MILITARY-INDUSTRIAL ACHIEVEMENTS, THE ECONOMY OF THE USSR REMAINS BOGGED DOWN AND NEEDS TECHNOLOGICAL AND ORGANIZATIONAL MODERNIZATION, AND THIS IS IMPOSSIBLE WITHOUT ASSISTANCE FROM THE WEST. ADDITION, THE BACKHARD STATE OF AGRICULTURE COMPELS THE USSR TO BUY GRAIN REGULARLY IN THE WEST. TWO BAD HARVESTS IN SUCCESSION WITHOUT SUCH PURCHASES COULD SHAKE THE SOVIET ECONOMY AND EVEN PROVOKE MASS UPHEAVALS.

8. FURTHER, DETENTE IS EXPLAINED, AS I SEE IT, BY TWO NOT FULLY CLEAR BUT REAL CIRCUMSTANCES: FIRST, BY THE FACT THAT THE US AND THE USSR REGARD EACH OTHER AS THE ONLY EQUAL PARTNERS; SECOND, THAT THEY ALONG WITH OTHER DEVELOPED COUNTRIES ARE BEGINNING TO CONSIDER THEMSELVES NOT ONLY RIVALS BUT ALSO TO A CERTAIN DEGREE AS ALLIES --



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SOMEWHAT LIKE A GROUP OF WELL-FED IN A CROWD OF HUNGRY.

I SPEAK OF THESE TENDENCIES RECOGNIZING THAT OPPOSING TENDENCIES ARE AT WORK AND THAT THE USSR REMAINS IN THE EYES OF THE US, AS BEFORE, A DESTRUCTIVE FORCE. WHETHER OR NOT THE AMERICAN LEADERS RECOGNIZE IT, A FUNDAMENTAL CHANGE IN THE FOREIGN POLICY OF THE USSR IS IMPOSSIBLE WITHOUT A CHANGE IN ITS INTERNAL SITUATION.

16. IT IS DIFFICULT TO IMAGINE A STATE COMBINING CONSTANT SUPPRESSION AND VIOLENCE INTERNALLY WITH PEACEFUL BEHAVIOR AND ACCOMMODATION EXTERNALLY. SUCH "PEACEFUL BEHAVIOR" COULD ONLY BE THE CONSEQUENCE OF MILITARY HEAKNESS OR OF DECEPTIVE CAMOUPLAGE. THEREFORE, ANY RELAXATION IN THE INTERNAL POLICIES OF THE USSR SHOULD BE DESIRABLE TO THE AMERICANS NOT ONLY OUT OF HUMANITARIAN CONSIDERATIONS, IT IS ALSO VITALLY IMPORTANT TO THEM FOR REASONS OF THEIR OWN SECURITY, AND THEREFORE CAN BE REGARDED AS ONE OF THE OB-JECTIVES OF U.S. POLICY.

11. SINCE THE U.S., IN WORKING OUT ITS POLITICAL STRATEGY, CHOSE COOPERATION WITH THE U.S.S.R. RATHER THAN ITS ISOLA-TION, TWO TACTICAL VARIATIONS WERE POSSIBLE:

TO MOVE TOWARD RAPPROCHEMENT EXPECTING THAT THE COOPERATION OF THE US AND THE WEST IN GENERAL WOULD GRADU-ALLY "SOFTEN" THE USSR.

2. TO TIE EVERY STEP TOWARD THE USSR TO A DEMAND FOR A PARTICULAR CHANGE IN BOTH INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL POLICIES, UNDERSTANDING THEIR INTERDEPENDENCY.

AN IMPRESSION HAS BEEN CREATED THAT RICHARD M. NIXON AND HENRY A. KISSINGER CHOSE THE FIRST PATH AS THE ONE SEEMINGLY REQUIRING LESS EFFORT AND GIVING VISIBLE RESULTS PROMPTLY. MR. KISSINGER SOUGHT TO RESOLVE IN BARELY THO YEARS THE CHALLENGE OF RAPPROCHEMENT WITH THE USSR, A TASK REQUIRING, LET US SAY, THO DECADES. SUCH HASTE POSSIBLY REFLECTS NOT ONLY THE MENTALITY OF MR. KISSINGER HIMSELF BUT ALSO THE FEATURES OF AMERICAN MENTALITY IN GENERAL --THE MENTALTY OF BUSINESSMEN WHO WANT TO SEE AT ONCE THE TANGIBLE RESULTS OF THEIR EFFORTS.



THIS LED THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT TO THE HASTY SIGNING OF A SERIES OF AGREEMENTS ONLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PRESENTING THEM TO THE CITIZENS ON TELEVISION AND SAYINGS -LOOK! WE HAVE DONE THIS AND THIS AND THIS." BUT T U.S! IS DEALING WITH A PARTNER WITH WHICH IT IS DANGEROUS TO

MAKE HASTE. EVEN IF THE SOVIET LEADERS DO NOT POSSESS THE MANY BRILLIANT QUALITIES OF MR. KISSINGER, THEY ARE ABLE TO A SUPERLATIVE DEGREE TO SET THEMSELVES DISTANT GOALS AND ALBO TO WAIT PATIENTLY.

14. AMERICAN POLICY DIFFERS FROM SOVIET POLICY IN TWO OTHER FEATURES. FOREIGN POLICY IN A WAY IS A PUPIL OF INTERNAL POLICY, THE MENTALITY OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS RISING TO FOREIGN POLICY LEADERSHIP HAS BEEN SHAPED FOR YEARS BY DEALING WITH INTERNAL POLITICAL PROBLEMS, AND ALL THE METHO ODS THEY HAVE MASTERED INSIDE THE COUNTRY ARE APPLIED ABROAD.

AMERICAN DOMESTIC POLICIES ARE BASED ON A PLAY OF FREE PORCES, SETTLED BY COMPROMISE, WHILE SOVIET DOMESTIC POLI-CIES ARE BASED ON A NO-COMPROMISE IMPLEMENTATION OF IN-STRUCTIONS. AND WHILE THE US MAY SIT DOWN AT THE NEGOTIA-TING TABLE CONSCIOUSLY OR SUBCONSCIOUSLY THINKING OF COM-PROMISE, THE USSR SITS DOWN WITH THE INTENTION OF ACHIEVING ITS OBJECTIVES IN FULL, AGREEING ONLY TO FICTITIOUS CONCES-SIONS.

16. THE OTHER STRANGE FEATURE OF AMERICAN POLICY, AS WITH THE POLICY OF THE WEST IN GENERAL, IS THE TREATMENT OF THE USSR LIKE A SMALL CHILD WHO MUST BE ALLOWED EVERYTHING AND NOT BE IRRITATED BECAUSE HE MIGHT START SCREAMING -- ALL BECAUSE, THEY SAY, WHEN IT GROWS UP IT WILL UNDERSTAND EVERYTHING.

17. FOR. SPOCK | METHODS. THIS PROLONGED "UPBRINGING" OF THE USSR BY THE METHODS OF DR. SPOCK IS REFLECTED NOT ONLY IN AN ENDLESS NUMBER OF MINOR CONCESSIONS BY THE US BUT ALSO IN ACTIONS THAT ARE SIMPLY HUMILIATING FOR ITS PRESTIGE AS A BIG POWER. THIS WAS MOST CLEARLY ILLUSTRATED BY THE RELUCTANCE OF PRESIDENT FORD TO INVITE ALEKSANDR I. SOLZ-HENITSYN TO THE WHITE HOUSE BECAUSE MR. KISSINGER FEARED THIS WOULD INFURIATE LEONID I BREZHNEY.

FORD

18. SUCH BEHAVIOR IN GENERAL IS VERY TYPICAL FOR REPRE-

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SENTATIVES OF THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT. THUS, AN AMERICAN DIPLOMAT WITH WHOM I HAVE BEEN ACQUAINTED FOR MORE THAN 10 YEARS AND WHO RECENTLY RETURNED TO MOSCOW DECLINED FOR THE SAME REASONS TO MEET WITH ME, ALTHOUGH HE DID SEND EXPRES-SIONS OF HIS SYMPATHY VIA AN INTERMEDIARY.

19. KNONING THE CHARACTER OF THOSE WHOM THE AMERICANS ARE TRYING TO PLAY UP TO BY SUCH BEHAVIOR, I BELIEVE THAT EVEN THOUGH IT WINS APPROVAL FROM THEIR SIDE IT ALSO AROUSES A DEGREE OF CONTEMPT.

20. AS I GET OLDER, IT BECOMES EVER CLEARER TO ME THAT THE BEST IN THE WORLD FINDS ITS EXPRESSION IN SIMPLE HUMAN RELATIONSHIPS: THE LOVE OF A HUSBAND FOR HIS HIFE AND PAR-ENTS FOR THEIR CHILDREN, THE COMRADESHIP OF MEN, COMPASSION, PATIENCE AND SIMPLE DECENCY; WHILE ANY IDEOLOGY AND DOC-TRINE, IF NOT USED WITH CARE AS A WORKING HYPOTHESIS, MAY LEAD TO THE CHOPPING OFF OF HEADS OR, IN THE BEST OF CASES, TO THE STUFFING OF MONEY BAGS.

21. THE FACT THAT TWO PERSONS WHO HERE ABLE TO MEET MORE THAN 10 YEARS AGO WITHOUT ANY INTERFERENCE AND NOW, IN THE PERIOD OF "DETENTE," ARE UNABLE TO MEET DOES NOT SPEAK IN FAVOR OF DETENTE'S HUMANITARIAN ASPECTS.

22. IT DOES NOT SEEM TO ME CORRECT, IN LIGHT OF THE LONG-RANGE PROBLEMS OF THE U.S. RATHER THAN THE IMMEDIATE ONES, THAT THERE IS A DESIRE "NOT TO OVERLOAD" DETENTE, AS MR. KISSINGER HAS SAID, WITH HUMANITARIAN PROBLEMS, AND TO YIELD ON HUMANITARIAN ISSUES AS POLITICALLY UNIMPORTANT AND ANNOY-ING TO THE U.S.S.R., ALL IN ORDER TO PROMOTE THE SALE OF PEPSI-COLA.

23. THE BASIS OF STABILITY. IF THE US SETS ITSELF THE OBJECTIVE OF ESTABLISHING TRULY FRIENDLY RELATIONS WITH THE USSR AND WANTS TO BE ASSURED OF THEIR DURABILITY, THEN IT MUST STRIVE FOR THE TRANSFORMATION OF THE CLOSED SOVIET SYSTEM TO AN OPEN ONE. THE AWAKENING OF THE SOVIET PEOPLE TO HUMAN RIGHTS IS A FORCE WORKING IN THIS DIRECTION.

24. INASMUCH AS THE MOVEMENT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS HAS NO TROOPS, THE POLITICIAN POLICEMEN AND THE POLITICIAN BUSI-NESSMEN ARE INCLINED TO SLIGHT IT. BUT IT SEEMS TO ME THAT IT IS PRECISELY THE WORLD MOVEMENT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS THAT WILL SECOME A WORLD-TRANSFORMING FORCE THAT WILL OVERCOME BOTH INHUMANITY BASED ON VIOLENCE AND INHUMANITY BASED ON INDIFFERENCE.

GENUINE STABILITY COMES ONLY IN A PROCESS OF MOVEMENT, ONLY IN THE EXPANSION OF INPLUENCE. THE US MUST STRIVE FOR A TRANSFORMATION OF THE WORLD IF IT WANTS IT TO BE MORE STABLE. A SYSTEM THAT DOES NOT SET EXPANSIONIST GOALS FOR ITSELF CONTRACTS AND DIES AWAY. THE WORLD WAS EXPERIENCED MANY FORMS OF EXPANSION -- MILITARY, ECONOMIC AND CULTURAL. IF THE US CAN BECOME THE CENTER OF A NEW EXPANSION, A HUMANITARIAN EXPANSION BASED ON HUMAN RIGHTS THROUGHVU!;: WORLD, ITS FUTURE WOULD BE ASSURED FOR A LONG TIME.

26. IT IS INTERESTING THAT THIS IDEALISTIC ELEMENT HAS ALREADY, TO A LESSER OR GREATER DEGREE, BEEN FELT IN AMER-ICAN POLITICS DURING THE ENTIRE HISTORY OF THE U.S. THE OLD-FASHIONED EUROPEAN POLITICAL MENTALITY -- WITHOUT AN UNDERSTANDING OF HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE AND HITHOUT INTEREST IN HIGHER GOALS -IS NOT LIKELY TO LONG DOMINATE THE FOREIGN POLICY OF THE U.S. NO MATTER HOW MUC MORE MR. KISSINGER WANTS TO CAST ASIDE HUMANITARIAN PROB EMS, THEY COME TO THE SURFACE BY ONE MEANS OR ANOTHER. THIS IS PARTICULARLY EVIDENT IN THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE ADMINISTRATION AND THE CONGRESS OVER THE QUESTION OF TRADE AND OF EMIGRATION FROM THE USSR.

27. THESE DIFFERENCES, ALTHOUGH RESTRICTING THE ADMINIS TRATION, ALSO DO GIVE IT CERTAIN BENEFITS. THE TRIANGLE OF MR. KISSINGER, MR. BREZHNEY AND HENRY M. JACKSON REMINDS HE SOMEWHAT OF THE SITUATION WHEN A CRIMINAL IS BEING INDUCED TO CONFESS BY TWO INTERROGATORS, ONE O? WHOM -- SENATOR JACKSON -- SHOUTS AND BEATS HIS FIST ON THE TABLE, AND THE OTHER-SECRETARY OF STATE KISSINGER-WHO SMILES AND GENTLY PROMISES LENIENCY. SO THE HEART OF THE CRIMINAL, FACED WITH SUCH CONTRASTS, OPENS UP TO THE KND SMILE.

THE US GOVERNMENT EVIDENTLY IS FEELING THE PRESSURE OF BUSINESS CIRCLES, HEADED BY MAKERS OF SOFT DRINKS. INTERESTED IN COOPERATION WITH THE USSR BECAUSE THEY CONSIDER IT A GIGANTIC POTENTIAL MARKET FOR THEIR PRODUCTS: AND A SOURCE OF RAW MATERIALS AND CHEAP LABOR. ONE CAN



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ONLY WELCOME ECONOMIC COOPERATION IF IT IS ONE OF THE ELEMENTS OF THE POLICY OF DETENTE, BUT NOT A FORCE SHAPING THIS POLICY.

29. WITHOUT DOUBT, BUSINESSMEN HAVE MADE AN ENORMOUS CONTRIBUTION TO THE CREATION OF MODERN AMERICA, BUT WHEN THEY BECAME THE LEADING POLITICAL FORCE THEY LED THE U.S. TO THE BRINK OF DISASTER-TO THE GREAT DEPRESSION OF THE 193015.

AMERICANS ARE A PEOPLE EASILY CARRIED AWAY. WHEN THEY WERE CARRIED ARAY BY THE COLD RAR, I DON'T KNOW WHETHER THERE WERE SOBER VOICES PROPOSING SOME KIND OF ALTERNTIVE. NOW THE AMERICANS ARE CARRIED AWAY BY "DETENTE, " AND IT IS GOOD THAT WARNING VOICES ARE BEING HEARD. THE WARNING IS THAT DETENTE REQUIRES RESTRAINT AND DETERMINATION -- NOT MERELY A WILLINGNESS TO COMPROMISE -- AND THAT MEEK CONCESSIONS WILL ONLY LEAD TO DEMANDS FOR MORE CONCESSIONS, PERHAPS THE VOICES WILL BE HEEDED.

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31. THE ALTERNATIVE TO DETENTE, WHICH ITS SUPPORTERS HAVE DEMANDED TO HEAR FROM ITS CRITICS, IS DETENTE CARRIED OUT DIFFERENTLY, DETENTE IN WHICH LONG-RANGE GOALS ARE NOT SACRIFICED TO SHORT-TERM GOALS; AND ONE MUST LEARN TO WAIT FOR WHAT IS DESIRED.

32. FOREIGN POLICY DOES NOT EXIST BY ITSELF. IT IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF A COUNTRY'S INTERNAL CONDITION, WHICH IN TURN DEPENDS UPON EXTERNAL CONDITIONS. IF ONE ACCEPTS THE PREMISE THAT WITHOUT RAPPROCHEMENT WITH THE USSR THE US CANNOT EXERT INFLUENCE ON IT, THEN ONE MUST SAY THAT IF THIS INFLUENCE IS NOT IN A CONSTRUCTIVE DIRECTION THE RAPPROCHEMENT WILL BE EVEN DANGEROUS FOR THE US. WHEN THE USSR MUST PAY FOR EVERY BUSMEL OF GRAIN AND FOR EVERY TECHNOLOGICAL SECRET NOT SO MUCH WITH GOLD AS WITH A STEP TOWARD DEMOCRATIZATION OF ITS SOCIETY, ONLY THEN WILL ITS FOREIGN POLICY CEASE TO PRESENT A THREAT TO THE WEST.

HOWEVER, THIS EXCHANGE, THIS "GENTLE PRESSURE" SHOULD NOT HAVE THE CHARACTER OF WOUNDING THE SELF-RESPECT OF THE USSR. LET IT PROCEED UNDER THE BANNER OF DEMANDING FULFILLMENT FROM THE USSR OF THE INTERNATIONAL DECLARA-TIONS IT HAS SIGNED, AND EVERY CONCESSION SHOULD BE



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LOOKED UPON NOT AS A "VICTORY FOR THE WEST" BUT RATHER AS A STEP TOWARD COMMON GOOD.

34. IN THE EMERGING TRIANGLE OF POWERS, THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE US TOWARD THE USSR AND CHINA, AMID SOME SIMILARI-TIES, IS VERY DIFFERENT. CHINA HAS NOT DEVELOPED YET TO THE LEVEL OF TRUE PARTNERSHIP WITH THE US ECONOMICALLY. SOCIALLY OR POLITICALLY, AND MILITARILY IT PRESENTS MUCH LESS OF A DANGER TO THE US THAN DOES THE USSR. FURTHER, THE MAINSPRING OF REVOLUTION STILL HAS NOT UNWOUND IN CHINA. ANY ATTEMPT TO PUT PRESSURE ON CHINA FOR THE PURPOSE OF INTERNAL CHANGE MOST PROBABLY WILL YIELD NO RESULTS. CHINA IS STILL SO FAR FROM THE HEST THAT EVERYTHING THAT HAPPENS THERE IS REGARDED ALMOST LIKE SOMETHING ON THE MOON. CHINA IS STILL TOO "ALIEN" FOR PUBLIC OPINION IN THE WEST TO REACH OUT A HAND TO THOSE WHO ARE SUBJECTED TO PERSECUTION.

35. PRESSURE FROM THE WEST. IT IS A DIFFERENT MATTER WITH THE USSR. FROM THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF ITS TRAGIC EURASIAN GEOGRAPHIC SITUATION, RUSSIA HAS ALWAYS BEEN BOTH MORE SENSITIVE TO THE WEST AND MORE DANGEROUS TO THE HEST THAN HAS CHINA. THE MAINSPRING OF THE RUSSIAN REVOLUTION HAS COMPLETELY UNWOUND. AND MOVING NOW ONLY BY THE FORCE OF INERTIA, THE USSR WILL BE HIGHLY RESPONSIVE

UNCLASSIFIED TO PRESSURE FROM THE WEST, ALL THE MORE SO BECAUSE OF A HOSTILE CHINA AT ITS BACK. AND IT IS FULLY CLEAR THAT THE MORE THE RELATIONS OF THE USSR WITH THE WEST EXPAND, THE MORE IT BECOMES "FAMILIAR" TO THE WEST, THE MORE PUBLIC OPINION IN THE WEST HILL KEEP AN ALERT WATCH ON EVENTS IN THE USSR.

36. IF THE RIVALRY OF THE USSR AND CHINA BECOMES EVER SHARPER, AND I BELIEVE THAT IT WILL, THEN THE TIES OF THE US TO THE USSR AND CHINA WILL BECOME LIKE TWO SETS OF REINS IN THE HANDS OF THE AMERICAN LEADERS, WHICH THEY CAN USE TO GUIDE THE COURSE OF WORLD HISTORY.

37. BUT THE QUESTION IS, WILL THEY?

38. LET US ASSUME THAT A STATE OR A GROUP OF STATES, WORKING OUT LONG-RANGE POLICIES, SHOULD DEFINE THE GOALS,



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STRATEGY AND TACTICS. CHINESE ARE NOT HAPPY ABOUT U.S. SOVIET DETENTE, IF IT WERE WITHIN THEIR POWER, THEY WOULD PREVENT IT. "SECRETARY AND 81-YEAR OLD CHINESE LEADER MET LAST NIGHT. TWE ENDED OUR ISOLATION FROM EACH OTHER BECAUSE OF OUR PERCEPTIONS OF OUR NATIONAL INTEREST, I HE SAID, IAND WE WILL NURTURE OUR RELATIONSHIP BY RESPECTING EACH OTHER'S VIEWS REGARDING OUR NATIONAL INTEREST.

FOREIGN MINISTER CHIAD KUANHHUAIS ANSWERING TOAST DID LITTLE IF ANYTHING TO WARM THE AIR. FOUR TALKS, ! HE SAID, -HAVE ENABLED US TO HAVE A CLEARER UNDERSTANDING OF EACH OTHER'S VIEWS, THIS IS USEFUL.

#### 3. EVENING TELEVISION:

A. ABCI REASONER! JECRETARY OF STATE KISSINGER HAS HOST TO CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER CHIAO KUAN-HUA IN PEKING TONIGHT IN THE LAST FORMAL FUNCTION OF HIS CURRENT VISIT TO CHINA. THE FINAL TOASTS OF THE TWO DIPLOMATS WERE COOL. BUT KISSINGER SAID LATER THAT HE WAS SATISFIED WITH THE

VISIT, AND THAT PREPARATIONS ARE GOING AHEAD FOR PRES-IDENT FORD'S CHINA TRIP AFTER THANKSGIVING.

YESTERDAY IN AN UNSCHEDULED EVENT OF SIGNIFICANCE, KISSINGER HAD A LENGTHY MEETING WITH MAD TSENTUNG. ABC 18 DIPLOMATIC CORRESPONDENT, TED KOPPEL, REPORTS:

KOPPEL'S THE CHINESE PROVIDED THIS FILM, AND YOU'LL HAVE TO JUDGE FOR YOURSELVES, JUST HOW FRAIL THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CHINESE COMMUNIST PARTY REALLY IS. MAO IS ALMOST 82 AND SAID TO BE IN FAILING HEALTH, BUT MEETINGS SUCH AS THIS HAVE A SYMBOLIC VALUE HERE IN CHINA THAT IS BEYOND MEASURE. SECRETARY KISSINGER WAS INVITED TO BRING HIS WIFE, NANCY, AND SEVERAL OF HIS STAFF -- SEVEN ALL TOLLED INCLUDING HIS SECRETARY. ONLY AMB. BUSH AND WINSTON LORD, A TOP KISSINGER AIDE, STAYED FOR THE CONVERSATION.

THE AMERICAN SIDE DESCRIBED THE TALKS AS TUSEFULT. BY COMPARISON, THE CHINESE NEARLY BUBBLED OVER WITH INFORMATION THE CONVERSATION, SAID THE CHINESE, WAS HELD IN A FRIENDLY ATMOSPHERE ON A WIDE RANGE OF QUESTIONS.

CHAIRMAN MAD ASKED DR. KISSINGER TO CONVEY HIS REGARDS TO PRESIDENT FORD. IT WAS A VERY POSITIVE DMEN. NO QUESTION BUT THAT THE CHINESE ARE VERY UPSET OVER U.S. SOVIET DETENTE. THEY IVE MADE NO BONES ABOUT THAT. BUT THE HOUR AND FORTY MINUTES THAT MAD SPENT WITH KISSINGER LEAVES NO DOUBT THAT FOR THE TIME BEING, AT LEAST, THE CHINESE ARE WILLING TO SWALLOW THEIR DISPLEASURE AND KEEP SINO-AMERICAN RELATIONS MOVING IN A POSITIVE DIRECTION.

CHANCELLOR: SECRETARY OF STATE KISSINGER'S VISIT TO PEKING ENDED TODAY ON A CHILLY NOTE. IN A FINAL TOAST TO CHINESE LEADERS, KISSINGER SAID THAT SELF-INTEREST. NOT FRIENDSHIP! GOVERNS RELATIONS BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND PEKING.

CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER CHIAO KUAN-HUA REPLIED, COOLY, THAT THE TALKS GAVE EACH SIDE A CLEARER UNDERSTANDING OF THE OTHER SIDE, ONE SUBJECT ON WHICH THEY HAVE YERY DIFFERENT VIEWS IS DETENTE BETWEEN THE SOVIET UNION AND THE U.S. THAT WAS AMONG THE SUBJECTS DISCUSSED YESTERDAY WHEN KISSINGER AND HIS PARTY VISITED CHAIRMAN MAD. DON OLIVER REPORTS:

OLIVER: CHAIRMAN MAD RECEIVED THEM ALL FOR THE PICTURE -TAKING CEREMONY. HE EVEN SHOOK HANDS WITH ONE OF THE KISSINGER SECRETARIES WHO HAPPENED TO BE ALONG. KISSINGER AND TWO AIDES REMAINED BEHIND FOR THE TALKS THEMSELVES. THE MEETING LASTED AN HOUR AND FORTY MINUTES. THE CHINESE SAID LATER THE CONVERSATION COVERED A WIDE RANGE OF QUESTIONS, AND WAS HELD IN A FRIENDLY ATMOSPHERE, BUT ONE U.S. SOURCE SAID MAD STRONGLY QUESTIONED THE U.S. POLICY OF DETENTE WITH THE SOVIET UNION. PUBLICLY, THE CHINESE HAVE SAID DETENTE IS A FRAUD BUT PRIVATELY THEY ARE SAID TO VIEW THE SOVIET-AMERICAN RELATIONSHIP AS A THREAT TO CHINA. THE CHINESE HAVE INDICATED THAT SINOW AMERICAN RELATIONS WILL NOT IMPROVE UNTIL THE THREAT OF DETENTE IS ELIMINATED.

C. CBS CRONKITE: KISSINGER ENDED HIS LATEST TRIP TO CHINA WITH A DIPLOMATIC MIXED POUCH. HE DID GET TO HEET AT LENGTH WITH CHAIRMAN MAD TSE-TUNG, THEREBY GAINING A RENEWED PUBLIC ENDORSEMENT OF U.S.-CHINESE RELATIONS, BUT U.S.-SOVIET RELATIONS WERE SEEN AS A REASON FOR A CHILLY TOAST TONIGHT FROM THE CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER. HE SAID HIS TALKS WITH KISSINGER WERE USEFUL AND FRANK -- TERMS OFTEN TAKEN TO MEAN THINGS DIDN'T GO SO WELL. INGERSOLL BT

MEETING WITH BREZHNEV, SEVERAL MEMBERS ASKED ARBATOV WHETHER THE USSR WOULD BE PREPARED TO DISCUSS LIMITATIONS ON NAVAL DEPLOYMENTS IN THE INDIAN OCEAN WITH THE U.S. ON A BILATERAL BASIS. ARBATOV DID NOT HAVE AN AUTHORITATIVE ANSWER, SO WHEN HE PERSONALLY BRIEFED BREZHNEV JUST BEFORE THE LATTER'S MEETING WITH THE CODEL, ARBATOV NOTED THAT THIS QUESTION WAS LIKELY TO BE RAISED. BREZHNEV REPORTEDLY REPLIED THAT IF ASKED, HE WOULD SAY THAT THE ANSWER WAS "YES."

3. HOWEVER, ARBATOV CONTINUED, FOR WHATEVER REASON
THE QUESTION WAS NOT ASKED OF BREZHNEY WHEN HE SAW
