Background on South Moluccans: Two groups of South Moluccans have hijacked a train and taken over an Indonesian consulate in the Netherlands. They have already murdered several of the passengers from the train. These events seem to be timed to coincide with your trip to Indonesia.

The South Moluccans are descendents of East Indian and African slaves whom the Dutch took to work on the Molucca Islands in western Indonesia, when that country was a Dutch colony. They do not get along well with ethnic Indonesians who took over their islands in 1950. After an unsuccessful bloody uprising that year, 12,000 of them were forcibly moved to the Netherlands to avoid further bloodshed. About 35,000 of them are now in the Netherlands but they have not been assimulated into Dutch society.

The South Moluccans are divided into two groups in the Netherlands, both of which have uniformed paramilitary units. The larger Free South Molucca Republic group (named after the government established in the 1950 rebellion) has condemned the killing on the train. The smaller more radical group has also denounced violence in the past. Those conducting these violent acts are apparently an offshoot of these groups. South Moluccans have carried out violent acts before including: a 1970 attack on the Indonesian embassy; a 1974 gas bomb attack on the World Court; and a 1975 plot to kidnap Queen Juliana and demand Moluccan independence in exchange for her release.

MEMORANDUM FOR GENERAL SCOWCROFT FROM: THE SITUATION ROOM SUBJECT: MORNING NEWS SUMMARY

THE WASHINGTON POST

GEORGE WILSON SAYS THAT PRESIDENT FORD WILL TRY TO PUT A LID ON CIVILIAN AND MILITARY PAY INCREASES AND PUSH 85,000 PEOPLE OFF THE PENTAGON PAYROLL TO BRING THE NATION'S MILITARY BUDGET DOWN TO \$110 BILLION IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR. HE ALSO HAS TENTATIVELY DECIDED TO PUT OFF BUYING A NEW AIRCRAFT CARRIER AND TO DELAY OR CANCEL A NUMBER OF WEAPONS PROGRAMS -- INCLUDING FIGHTER PLANES, THE MINUTEMAN III ICBM AND THE LANCE BATTLEFIELD MISSILE. MR. FORD MADE HIS CHOICES IN CONSULTATION WITH THE OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET IN MEETINGS THAT EXCLUDED DEFENSE OFFICIALS -- INCLUDING NEWLY APPOINTED SECRETARY OF DEFENSE DONALD RUMSFELD. (A-1)

SENATOR HUGH SCOTT ANNOUNCED YESTERDAY THAT HE WON'T RUN FOR A FOURTH TERM IN THE 1976 ELECTIONS. HOWEVER, HE IS EXPECTED TO REMAIN IN THE SENATE AND KEEP HIS LEADERSHIP POST UNTIL HIS TERM EXPIRES. (A-1)

LAURENCE STERN REPORTS ON DETAILS OF A "MASSIVE" CAMPAIGN OF CLANDESTINE OPERATIONS OVER A TEN-YEAR PERIOD TO BLOCK THE ELECTION AND THEN TO OVERTHROW THE GOVERNMENT OF THE LATE SALVADOR ALLENDEIN CHILE REVEALED YESTERDAY BY THE SENATE INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEE. (A-1)

ACCORDING TO MURREY MARDER, SECRETARY KISSINGER PLANSTO GO TO MOSCOW LATER THIS MONTH IN A NEW ATTEMPT TO BREAK THE DEADLOCK IN THE U.S.-SOVIET NUCLEAR STRATEGIC ARMS LIMITATION TALKS. PREPARATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE TO ADD MOSCOW TO KIS) INGER'S ITINERSRY FOR A TRIP TO BRUSSELS, LONDON, AND PERIS THAT STARTS WEDNESDAY. IT WOULD TAKE VIRTUALLY A



LAST-MINUTE DECISON TO RULE OUT THE PROJECTED MOSCOW VISIT. MAJOR POLITICAL IMPLICATIONS SURROUND THE NUCLEAR STALEMATE. (A-1)

YUVAL ELIZUR SAYS THAT MONDAY'S ISRAELI AIR STRIKE IN LEB-ANON EVOKED ALMOST UNPRECEDENTED CRITICISM AMONG ISRAELI EDITORIAL WRITERS AND COMMENTATORS. GOVERNMENT JUSTIFICA-TIONS OF THE RAID, INCLUDING REPORTS THAT INTELLIGENCE SHOW-ED NEW GUERRILLA ATTACKS BEING PLANNED, HAVE FAILED TO PER-SUADE ALL ISRAELIS. MOST OUTSPOKEN WAS THE INFLUENTIAL DAILY HAARETZ WHICH ACCUSED PRIME MINISTER RABIN OF NOT WEIGHING CAREFULLY ENOUGH THE POSSBLE CONSEQUENCES OF THE AIR STRIKE. EVEN YEDIOT AHARONOT, WHICH USUALLY SUPPORTS HARDLINE GOVERNMENT POLICIES, QUESTIONED THE WISDOM OF THE ACTION, CLAIMING "MUCH IS STILL UNCLEAR ON THE MOTIVES THAT LED TO THE DECISION TO ATTACK." MEANWHILE, THE SECURITY COUNCIL DECIDED LAST NIGHT TO GRANT THE PLO THE RIGHT TO PARTICIPATE FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ONE OF ITS MEETINGS. GROUP WAS TO APPEAR BEFORE THE COUNCIL UNDER THE SAME CON-DITIONS AS A UN MEMBER-STATE. THE VOTE WAS NINE TO THREE IN FAVOR WITH THREE ABSTENTIONS. IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE VOTE THE PL4 DELEGATE TOOK A SEAT AT THE COUNCIL TABLE UNDER THE NAMEPLATE OF THE ORGANIZATION. THE ISRAELI DELEGATION RE-CEIVED FIRM INSTRUCTIONS TO BOYCOTT ANY SECURITY COUNCIL MEETINGS THE PLO ATTENDS AND WERE NOT IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER. FOR THE PRESENT THE POLTICAL ISSUE WAS NOT THE RAID OR WHAT THE COUNCIL WOULD DO IN RESPONSE, BUT THE PRECEDENT-SETTING MOVE BY EGYPT TO BRING THE PLO INTO THE COUNCIL, MOVING ANOTHER STEP TOWARD INTERNATIONAL LEGITIMIZATION OF (A-1)THE PLO.

ISRAELI'S AMBASSADOR TO WASHINGTON, DINITZ, SAID YESTERDAY THAT UN ACCEPTANCE OF THE PLO "WILL ONLY INCREASE THEIR LUST FOR MURDER AND RADICALIZE THEIR STAND." SPEAKING AT THE NPC, DINIZ SAID THAT THE TERRORIST ORGANIZATION HAS STARTED USING UN RESOLUTIONS AS JUSTIFICATION FOR ITS ACTIVITIES. DINITZ JUSTIFIED ISRAEL'S RETALIATORY RAIDS ON GUERRILLA BASES IN LEBANON BY SAYING THAT IN THE LAST THREE MONTHS HIS COUNTRY HAD SUFFERED 25 ACTS OF TERROR AGAINST AGRICULTURAL SETTLEMENTS, POPULATION CENTERS AND CITIES. THERE WERE 68 CASUALTIES, HE SAID, MOSTLY CIVILIAN. (A-15)

LOU CANNON REPORTS THAT PRESIDENT FORD DEPARTED FOR JAKARTA AFTER FOUR DAYS OF TALKS WITH CHINESE LEADERS THAT HE TERMED "FRIENDLY, CANDID, SUB)TANTIAL, AND CONSTRUCTIVE" BUT THAT PRODUCED NO NEW AGREEMENT OF ANY KIND. MR. FORD LEFT WITH ONE SMALL CONCESSION FROM THE CHINESE -- THE NAMES OF SEVEN MISSING NAVAL FLIERS WHO WERE SHOT DOWN OVER CHINA OR IN CHINESE WATERS BY THE NORTH VIETNAMESE AND WHO HAD BEEN LISTED AS MISSING IN ACTION. THESE NAMES WILL BE RELEASED



IN WASHINGTON AS SOON AS NEXT-OF-KIN ARE NOTIFIED. ON THE BASIC ISSUES THAT DIVIDE THE U.S. AND CHINA -- DETENTE WITH THE SOVIET UNION AND FORMAL RECOGNITION OF THE PEKING GOVERNMENT INSTEAD OF THE GOVERNMENT ON TAIWAN -- NEITHER THE PRESIDENT NOR KISSINGER MADE ANY CLAIM OF SUCCESS. (A-18)

ACCORDING TO LOU CANNON, "ALL THE AMERICAN PRESIDENTS LOOKED BACKWARD UNTIL NIXON," A CHINESE OFFICIAL SAID THE OTHER DAY. "PRESIDENT NIXON LOOKED FORWARD. PRESIDENT FORD IS JUST LOOKING." THIS FRANK APPRAISAL OF MR. FORD AS A RATHER TENTATIVE PRESIDENT WAS MADE TO A EUROPEAN, NOT TO AN AMERICAN. IT REFLECTS THE CHINESE UNDERSTANDING THAT MR. FORD MAY WELL BE EITHER AN INTERIM PRESIDENT OR THE AMERICAN CHIEF EXECUTIVE THE CHINESE WILL HAVE TO DEAL WITH IN THE TROUBLED YEARS AHEAD. (A-19)

JOSEPH KRAFT SAYS THAT HE HAS BEEN HIGHLY SKEPTICAL ABOUT THE CHINESE ARGUMENT, PUT AGAIN APPARENTLY BY CHAIRMAN MAO. THAT THE U.S. SHOULD ABANDON DETENTE WITH RUSSIA BECAUSE. AS FIRST VICE PREMIER TENG HSIAO-PING PUT IT TO PRESIDENT FORD. "THE FACTORS FOR WAR ARE CLEARLY INCREASING" AND "EUROPE IS THE FOCUS OF THIS CONTENTION." MR. CHOU WEI-CHANG SAID: "THE CENTER OF THE STRUGGLE BETWEEN THE SUPER POWERS IS IN THE WEST. BUT WE HAVE TO DEFEND OURSELVES. WE HAD A TRIAL WITH THE RUSSIANS IN 1969 ON THE NORTHERN FRONTIER, AND THEY WERE DEFEATED. NOW IF THE RUSSIANS TRY TO COME IN AGAIN, THEY WILL HAVE MORE TROUBLE. THEY MAY BE ABLE TO INVADE, BUT THEY WILL NOT BE ABLE TO GET OUT." STATEMENT MUST EXPRESS THE INDOCTRINATION WHICH HAS BEEN GIVEN TO MILLIONS AND MILLIONS OF CHINESE WHO HAVE LABORED HARD. USING SCARCE MATERIALS TO BUILD THOUSANDS OF SHELTERS. SO WHAT THE CHINESE ARE NOW SAYING IS NOT PURE RHETORIC. PEKING CLEARLY DOES EXPECT TROUBLE FROM THE RUSSIANS. BECAUSE THE CHINESE HAVE AN ULTERIOR MOTIVE, TO BE SURE, DOES NOT QUEER THEIR ARGUMENTS. THE SOVIET MILITARY BUILD-UP DOES NEED TO BE TAKEN SERIOUSLY, VERY SERIOUSLY IN FACT. BUT THE CHINESE ARGUMENT, PARTICULARLY IN THE HIGHLY RHETORICAL AND IMPRECISE FORM IT IS USUALLY EXPRESSED. IS FAR FROM BEING THE ULTIMATE GOSPEL ON WORLD AFFAIRS. CERTAINLY, THE U.S. SHOULD NOT BE DETERRED FROM TAKING STEPS TOWARD DETENTE IN THE ARMS CONTROL FIELD SIMPLY BECAUSE IT RUBS CHINA THE WRONG WAY. (A-23)

ACCORDING TO GEORGE WILL, ANOTHER TIGER OF EXTREMISM IS LOOSE IN THE UN, THIS TIME WITH THE CONSENT OF THE U.S. GOVERNMENT, WHICH COULD HAVE PREVENTED IT. IN A LAST MINUTE POLICY SWERVE, THE U.S. DASHED ISRAELI HOPES FOR A VETO -- HOPES THE ISRAELIS FELT WERE FIRMLY BASED ON U.S. ASSURANCES -- AND VOTED FOR A RESOLUTION THET THE U.S. KNEW WOULD GUARANTEE PARTICIPATION BY THE PLO IN NEXT MONTH'S UN

DEBATE ON THE MIDDLE EAST. THE INVITATION TO THE PLO WAS ATTACHED TO A SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE MANDATE OFTHE UN OBSERVER FORCE ON THE GOLAN HEIGHTS. BE-TWEEN ISRAELI AND SYRIAN FORCES. ON THE EVE OF EXPIRATION OF THE DISENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT. ISRAEL AGREED TO RENEWAL. BUT SYRIA, AWARE OF THE BRITTLENESS OF U.S. SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL. OPPOSED RENEWAL UNLESS IT INCLUDED THE INVITATION TO THE PLO. THE U.S. VOTED THE WAY IT DID FOR THE REASON THAT EVERYTHING HAPPENS IN U.S. FOREIGN POLICY: SECRETARY KISSINGER COMMANDED IT. AS LATE AS SATURDAY NIGHT, NOVEMBER 29. THE ISRAELIS WERE ASSURED THAT THE U.S. WOULD VETO THE RESOLUTION. SUNDAY MORNING KISSINGER CALLED THE UN AND ORDERED THE U.S. TO SIDE WITH SYRIA AND ITS CHIEF SPONSOR, THE SOVIET UNION, AGAINST ISRAEL. THIS IS AN EXAMPLE OF THE U.S. POLICY OF PREEMPTIVE CONCESSION. KISSINGER RE-PORTEDLY WAS TOLD BY OTHER DIPLOMATS BEFORE SUNDAY THAT U.S. FIRMNESS COULD GET THE PALESTINIAN QUESTION DELETED FROM THE RESOLUTION. AND IT IS HIGHLY PROBABLE THAT IF SYRIA HAD NOT BACKED DOWN. AND THE MANDATE HAD NOT BEEN RENEWED. NO-THING MUCH WOULD HAVE HAPPENED. THE SYRIAN GOVERNMENT IS NOT A FEAST OF REASON, BUT IT IS NOT CRAZY ENOUGH TO CANTEMPLETE A FAIR FIGHT, ALONE, AGAINST ISRAEL. THE U.S. VOTE WAS A GIANT STEP IN A DEPLORABLE DIRECTION: IT CONFERS LEGITIMACY ON A DICTATORIAL TERRORIST ORGANIZATION. THE PLO. AS THE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LONG-SUFFERING PALESTINIAN PEOPLE. . PERHAPS THE PLO'S RUTHLESSNESS, AND THE SUPPORT OF ITS TATALITARIAN ALLIES HAS MADE INEVITABLE THE ASCENDENCY OF THE PLO. BUT THE U.S. VOTEWAS NEEDLESS COMPLCITY IN THET ASCENDENCY. (A-23)

PRINCE SOUPHANOUVONG, THE "RED PRINCE" AND TITULAR HEAD OF THE PROCOMMUNIST PATHET LAO FORCES, WAS NAMED PRESIDENT OF THE NEW LAOTIAN PEOPLE'S DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC YESTERDAY. THE LAOTIAN NATIONAL CONGRESS ALSO NAMED KAYSONE PHOMYIHARN, A VETERAN POLITICAL AND MILITARY STRATEGIST IN THE PATHET LAO AS PRIME MINISTER. THE APPOINTMENTS FOLLOWED YESTERDAY'S ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ABOLITION OF THE 600-YEAR-OLD MONARCHY AND THE C&EATION OF A REPUBLIC IN THE LANDLOCKED NATION OF THREE MILLION PEOPLE. (A-24)

ACCORDING TO JACK ANDERSON AND LES WHITTEN THE SENATE INTELLIGENCE COMMITTEE WAS UNABLE TO PIN DOWN ANY PROOF THAT
PAST PRESIDENTS AUTHORIZED THE CIA TO ASSASSINATE FOREIGN
LEADERS. TOP CIA OFFICIALS, HOWEVER, HAVE NOW BROKEN THEIR
SILENCE ON THIS SUBJECT. THEY HAVE TOLD ANDERSON AND WHITTEN CATEGORICALLY THAT ALL THE ASSASSINATION PLOTS HAD
WHITE HOUSE APPROVAL. TO AVOID EMBARRASSING A PRESIDENT, NO
WRITTEN RECORD WAS KEPT. THIS PROVIDED THE PRESIDENTS WITH
WHAT THE SENATE REPORT CALLS "PLAUSIBLE DENIABILITY." BUT
THE CIA OFFICIALS HAVE GIVEN THEM THIS RUNDOWN:

- -- EISENHOWER ADMINISTRATION -- THE LATE CIA CHIEF ALLEN DULLES PERSONALLY CONSULTED PRESIDENT EISENHOWER ABOUT THE PLOT TO POISON THE CONGO'S PATRICE LUMUMBA.
- -- KENNEDY ADMINISTRATION -- THE LATE ROBERT F. KENNEDY, ACCORDING TO ANDERSON AND WHITTEN'S SOURCES, TOOK A PERSONAL INTEREST IN THE EFFORT TO ELIMINATE CUBA'S FIDEL CASTRO.
- -- JOHNSON ADMINISTRATION -- PRESIDENT JOHNSON, UPON BEING ADVISED OF THE CIA PLOTS TO ASSASSINATE FOREIGN LEADERS, MADE IT CLEAR HE DIDN'T WANT TO KNOW ABOUT THEM. THERE WERE SOME ACTIVITIES, HE INDICATED, THAT THE PRESIDENT SHOULDN'T BE TOLD ABOUT.
- -- NIXON ADMINISTRATION -- PRESIDENT NIXON WAS GIVEN AN ORAL BRIEFING ON THE ASSASSINATION ATTEPTS, A BRIEFING WHICH MIGHT HAVE BEEN RECORDED ON THE SECRET WHITE HOUSE TAPES.

ANDERSON AND WHITTEN'S SOURCES SAY NIXON WAS "GUNG HO" ABOUT COVERT ACTIVITIES, THAT HE PERSONALLY ORDERED CA CHEF RICHARDHELMS TO FOMENT A COUP AGAINST CHILE'S LATE P&ESIDENT SALVADOR ALLENDE. BUT NIXON GAVE NO ASSASSINBTION ORDERS. CLEARLY, NOT ONLY THE CIA BUT THE WHITE HOUSE MUST BE RESTRICTED AGAINST USING MURDER AS AN INSTRUMENT OF U.S. FOREIGN POLICY. (D-18)

JUAN DE ONIS REPORTS THAT A WAVE OF POLITICAL ASSASSINATIONS IN ARGENTINA CAUSED PRESIDENT PERON TO HOLD AN EMERGENCY MEETING OF THE NATIONAL DEFENSE COUNCIL TO CONSIDER THE SECURITY SITUATION. (7)

PETER KIHSS REPORTS THAT AN INITIAL BATCH OF 894 PAGES OF CIA FILES HAVE BEEN RELEASED ON THE 25-YEAR-OLD CASE THAT SENT JULIUS AND ETHEL ROSENBERG TO THEIR DEATHS FOR PLOTTING ATOMIC SPYING IN BEHALF OF THE SOVIET UNION. (9)

WHAT PROSPECTS REMAIN FOR DETENTE DEPEND AT LEAST IN PART ON MAINTAINING A MILITARY BALANCE. A THOROUGH CONGRESSIONAL EVALUATION IS NEEDED. (38)

JAMES RESTON COMMENTS THAT THE ONLY HAPPY THOUGHT AROUND HERE THESE DAYS IS THAT SO MANY THINGS ARE GOING WRONG THAT MAYBE SOMETHING WILL FINALLY BE DONE ABOUT THEM. BUT ONLY MAYBE. IT'S A WELL-KNOWN RULE IN WASHINGTON THAT NOTHING COMPELS REFORM LIKE SOME IMMINENT DISASTER, OR SPECTACULAR STUPIDITY, AND WE NOW HAVE SO MUCH OF BOTH ON THE NATIONAL AGENDA THAT YOU HAVE TO HAVE SOME HOPE. EACH DAY'S HORROR STORIES ABOUT THE PAST CRIMES OF THE FBI AND THE CIA, FOR EXAMPLE, ADD TO THE PROSPECT THAT THE CONGRESS WILL FINALLY TAKE THESE SEC&ET AGENCIES BY THE THROAT. (39)

CHARLES BLUHDORN COMMENTS THAT WE SAY THAT WE ARE A WORLD

POWER TODAY BUT WE WERE A WORLD POWER IN DECEMBER 1941 AND NOBODY QUESTIONED IT. THERE WAS NO UN IN THOSE DAYS BE-CAUSE, AFTER ALL, IT MUST BE REMEMBERED THAT WE WERE THE ORIGINATORS OF THAT WORLD BODY. HE IS HAPPY TO SAY THAT WE HAVE SINCE WATCHED THIS ORGANIZATION GROW TO A MEMBERSHIP OF OVER 100. HE IS SICK TO HIS STOMACH WHEN HE CONTEMPLATES HOW MANY MEMBERS OF THE UN HAVE NOW TAKEN TO A REGULAR DIET OF ABUSING THE ONE NATION THAT MADE THE VERY EXISTENCE OF THAT ORGANIZATION POSSIBLE. (39)

Next NATO Summit



During the May 1975 NATO Summit in Brussels. Prime Minister Trudcau proposed that the NATO Heads of Government agree to meet more frequently. The President strongly endorsed that proposal. We are now at the point where a decision must be taken on whether or not to schedule a NATO summit for 1976.

State, via our Mission in Brussels, is currently entering into negotiations with Secretary Ceneral Luns and the Norwegians with a U.S. proposal to change the dates of the NATO Spring Ministerial Meeting currently set for May 19-20, 1976 in Oslo. State is pointing out that these dates conflict with the timing of the May 17-20 Giscard visit to the United States, noting that the Secretary of State will be participating in that visit, and, accordingly, requesting that the Spring Ministerial be rescheduled for May 20-21.

The date for the Spring Ministerial will be confirmed by Alliance Foreign Ministers during their meeting next week, December 11-12, in Brussels.

I am advised by State's European Bureau that there presently are no papern either written or planned recommending a summit. Considering the clear stand the President took in favor of Trudeau's proposal, I do not believe this is an issue which should be neglected. If the decision is taken to hold NATO's Spring meeting at the ministerial level, a year will have elapsed when it takes place, and the 1975 words of the President and Prime Minister Trudeau will be empty.

If the President is looking forward to a NATO Summit in 1976, I believe it would be most appropriate to have the Heads of Government meeting replace the Ministerial meeting scheduled for Oslo in May. While the late May/carly June period would seem relatively good in terms of the President's crowded 1976 calendar, State's new proposed dates of May 20-21 would not seem satisfactory again because of the timing of the Ciscard visit.




During the May 1975 NATO Summit in Brussels, Prime Minister Trudeau proposed that the NATO Heads of Government agree to meet more frequently, and you endorsed his proposal. At present, there is no planning underway for a 1976 summit. However, the December 11-12, 1975 NATO Ministerial meeting in Brussels presents the United States with the appropriate occasion to propose a Heads of Government meeting during the coming year.

This memorandum is forwarded to obtain your guidance on the desirability of scheduling a 1976 NATO Summit. I have discussed this with Secretary Kissinger, and we agree that the pros and cons relating to such a meeting are as follows:

Pros

- a 1976 NATO Summit would advance U.S. foreign policy interests, publicly demonstrating the continuing strength and cohesion of the Alliance, as well as the importance attached to regular consultations by the member Heads of Government,
- a summit would permit a frank review of the major tasks before the Alliance, including a review of the progress in implementing the six primary tasks you identified in your 1975 NATO address.
- by the Spring of 1976, it would be timely to have a NATO Heads of Government review of developments relating to SALT, MBFR and CSCE implementation.
- the majority of NATO Heads of Government and the NATO Secretary General would quickly support a U.S. proposal for a summit. (In keeping with their longstanding policy toward NATO, the French initially would oppose. The Greeks and the Turks might reserve their positions pending some forward movement on Cyprus,)



-- a 1976 summit would implement the Trudeau proposal which you endorsed in 1975.

Cons

- -- The principal drawback to a 1976 summit would appear to be your very crowded Bicentennial/election year calendar.
- -- If a summit is to be scheduled it would be logical for the Heads of Government meeting to replace the NATO Spring Ministerial meeting now scheduled for Oslo, May 18-19, 1976. These NATO Spring Ministerial dates overlap with President Giscard d'Estaing's May 17-20 visit to the United States.

If there are not other scheduling complications, the United States should be able to negotiate a change in the NATO dates to avoid a conflict with the Giscard dates. In my opinion, because of the foreign policy advantages involved, we should explore the possibility of a 1976 summit with our NATO allies. With your approval, I will so advise the Secretary of State.

Suggest you use the following language for the two items of which you requested clearance:

"It is difficult to exaggerate the economic importance and potential of the Pacific Basin for the United States. Our trade with the region has increased in recent years by more than 30% annually, reaching \$46 billion last year. American exports to the region exceeded \$22 billion in 1974. Our direct investment in the Pacific Basin has risen from \$7 billion in 1970 to \$11 billion in 1974, and it is increasing by \$1 billion a year."

"In 1974 our trade with East Asia amounted to 23% of our worldwide total, and for the last three years it has exceeded our trade with the European Community."

Comments:

- 1. I do not know where the \$93 billion figure could have come from, unless someone doubled the actual \$46 billion figure for two-way trade, thinking it represented only one direction. The \$46 billion figure does correspond to the \$22 billion figure used later in the paragraph.
- 2. I have suggested the deletion in/ second and third sentences because the numbers are irregular, less meaningful because of Indochina, and

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give the impression of a growing deficit. More importantly, we will have a decline in real terms, and perhaps even in nominal terms, in 1975.

3. The insert in the second section strengthens the statement.

BACKGROUND:

King Hussein has delegated full responsibility for Jordan's economic development to Crown Prince Hassan. Hassan comes to Washington periodically to discuss Jordan's needs with State, AID and members of the Congress, as well as to promote interest among US business firms in investment possibilities in his country, and he is extremely serious in his efforts. Hassan is also one of the inner council of Hussein's

advisors on political affairs. He is thus an important asset to our own interests in a viable Jordan, particularly with respect to the future of the West Bank and the eventual resolution of the Palestinian problem.

The Crown Prince will want to review Jordan's economic plans as well as the prevailing Middle East situation, in advance of King Hussein's planned visit to the US in March.

At this sensitive period in the Middle East negotiations, a meeting with Hassan would provide you a timely opportunity to emphasize to the Jordanians the importance we attach to their cooperation in the peace-making process and our determination not to permit the momentum of the negotiations to falter.

1. As mentioned in my previous messages, I believe that beyond the obvious importance of the substance, the deliberative process and perceptions of that process are of considerable importance by themselves. That is why it is exceedingly, important to have a VP meeting and NSC meeting in Washington with all the principals in attendance. Unless there is some aspect of it of which I am unaware, I cannot see why the selection of a particular day for a visit to Moscow should be allowed to affect adversely either the process or perceptions of it. Accordingly, one obvious alternative would be to check with the Soviets to see if a delay of two or three days in HAK's meeting could be arranged. The only other alternative would be for me to delay my departure for NATO. Since you will arrive in Washington early on 8 December and the DPC begins on the ninth, I could delay my departure until early evening of the eighth to permit a VP meeting beforehand. However, I plan to leave for Brussels In the A.M. of 7 December for bilateral meetings on the eighth. Further, HAK would still have to return for the NSC if we are to avoid the problems mentioned in referenced messages.


State Department Subpoena

The following are our thoughts concerning the contempt resolution against Secretary Kissinger and the chances of compromise.

First, all of the information available to the various Congressional liaison staffs indicates that if the contempt citation is put to a floor vote next week the vote will be heavily against Pike. Estimates range from two to one or three to one. At the same time there is, of course, no guarantee of the level of votes that might be cast against the Secretary of State. Les Aspin, for example, estimates about 75 to 100 votes against, but the White House staff believes that it could run higher, especially if there is a rather emotional and acrimonious debate about Kissinger.


Pressure has been put on Pike from many sources including the Speaker and key Congressional leaders to dissuade him, but our information is that he is determined to force a vote and go down fighting. Indeed, he may relish this role as a martyr and use it as a pretext to close down his Committee.

Third, the rumor is spreading that a compromise is in the air, and accordingly, if we do not now go forward with something, however minimal, we may be accused of provoking a conflict and alienate some



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Congressional elements and increase at least somewhat the size of the vote against us.

Thus, all of us (Jack Marsh, Phil Buchen, Larry Eagleburger,
Nino Scalia and Bill Hyland) believe that an offer should be made.
However, any offer raises two problems: (1) should we tie the offer to
the Executive privilege issue (and thereby appear to be compromising with
the principle) or make the offer in the context of the "40 Committee" Subpoena. We recommend the latter as a unilateral gesture of cooperation. We also recommend reaffirming the President's assertion of
Executive privilege although this would alienate some members. (2) should
we agree to provide information or State recommendations which were
disapproved by the 40 Committee. We have consistently declined to
provide disapprovals because to do so errodes the confidentiality of the
President's decision process. On the other hand, not to include them
may make it harder to get a compromise.

A new development is that Pike intends to file his report on Monday morning, thereby circumventing any Committee meeting in which he could be voted down. Even if this is so, we still have the problem of whether to offer a compromise, if only to strengthen the hands of our supporters in the House debate.

The unanimous recommendation here is (a) that a letter be sent to Pike signed by Phil Buchen answering the Pike letter of November 21; (b) that the letter address itself only to the issue of extending the examination of 40 Committee material to the period of 1961 to 1965; that this be offered under the same "guidelines" as followed thus far —which as you know would mean looking at highly sanitized descriptions and decision lines; (c) that we not specifically offer State Department recommendations nor mention in any way examination of disapprovals.

We believe that this will be seen as a constructive move that does not impair the principle of executive privilege but will demonstrate a willingness to work out a reasonable compromise. On balance, we believe this will not be read as a last-minute capitulation, which has been our main concern here. The text for you, the Secretary, and the President to consider follows.

BEGIN TEXT:



Dear Mr. Chairman:

The President has asked me to reply on his behalf to your thoughtful letter of November 21. He has further asked me to tell you that he appreciates the fact that you and your Committee permitted representatives of the Executive Branch to appear for testimony on November 20, and shares your hope that the remaining "underlying issues" may be removed.

We are pleased that, by working together in a spirit of compromise, we have already moved a long way toward resolving the issues that have arisen since November 6. It is our hope that by continuing to work together in that same spirit, we can find a way to accommodate the few issues still outstanding.

As you know, in order to provide your Committee with the substance of the information it sought to obtain by the November 6 subpoenas, the Executive Branch identified the originating agency with respect to all covert actions conducted from 1965 to the present. The President authorized this step because of his desire to meet the legitimate needs of the Committee for information on covert operations, although such detail was not required under any of the three subpoenas.

As a further demonstration of our desire for accommodation, the President has authorized me to inform you and your Committee that,

since the 40 Committee subpoens covered only the period 1965 to the present, we will supplement the information already given to your Committee by providing similar information for the years 1961 through 1964 under the guidelines we have followed thus far. This additional step should, we believe, make it possible for the Committee to obtain the information that your letter indicated was necessary without affecting the President's claim of Executive privilege.

I sincerely hope, Mr. Chairman, that this further example
of the President's desire to help the Committee carry out its important
responsibilities will receive a favorable response by the Committee.





We feel that if we are to make this move we need to do to tomorrow morning (saturday) Washington time, in order to permit our supporters on the Pike Committee to mount a counteroffensive and to have it on the public record for the weekend press and for the opening of Congressional business on Monday.

PRC SEEKS PANAMANIAN COMME&CIAL OUTLET: KEY CHINESE OFFI-CIALS ARE REPORTEDLY URGING PEKING TO ESTABLISH A COMMERCIAL UIRM IN PANAMA'S FREE ZONE, AND THE PANAMANIANS WILL PROBABLY ALLOW OPERATIONS TO BEGIN EARLY NEXT YEAR. TOP PANAMANIAN OFFICIALS ARE SAID TO HAVE ASSURED A CHINESE TRADE DELEGATION IN OCTOBER THAT THEY WOULD TRY TO AID CHINA IN ESTABLISHING A FIRM IN THE GOVERNMENT-OPERATED COLON FREE ZONE. TO DIA, PANAMA HAS NO DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH PEKING AND MAY NOT BE WILLING TO RISK THEM AT THIS STAGE IN CANAL TREATY NEGOTIATIONS. NEVERTHELESS, THE OBVIOUS POLITICAL BENEFITS OF ALLOWING SOME CHINESE COMMERCIAL REPRESENTATION MAKE GRANTING SUCH A REQUEST LIKELY. PANAMANIAN OFFICALS, CURRENTLH CONCERNED WITH A LAGGING ECONOMY AND DECLINING GOVERNMENT INCOME, WOULD ALSO TEND TO FAVOR ADDITIONAL FOR-EIGN INVESTMENT. FOR THEIR PART, CHINESE TRADE REPRESENTATIVES REPORTEDLY BELIEVE THE VENTURE WOULD BECOME PROFITABLE QUICKLY AND WOULD ALSO ALLOW FOR THE EVENTUAL EXPANSION OF CHINA'S

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INFLUENCE IN LATIN AMERICA. IF PEKING APPROVES THE PROJECT, WHICH APPEARS LIKELY, AN ADVANCE TEAM SHOULD ARRIVE IN PANAMA TO BEGIN THE PROCESS WITHIN A FEW MONTHS.

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
