MEMORANDUM OF CONVERSATION

PARTICIPANTS: President Ford
Dr. Henry A. Kissinger, Secretary of State
Lt. General Brent Scowcroft, Assistant to the
President for National Security Affairs

DATE AND TIME: Wednesday, February 11, 1976
4:32 - 5:14 p.m.

PLACE: Oval Office

Kissinger: You were spectacular at the meeting.

President: I thought I didn't sparkle at all.

Kissinger: You were very much a President-in-charge and everyone knows what you are after. After the elections this government needs overhauling -- it is close to being corrupt.

I think probably you should go to III, but II is far better for us.

President: I agree it is.

Kissinger: Don has discovered arms control, Brown is for III, and Ikle.

President: He is the worst. Once this thing is over, he is finished. But what should we do?

Kissinger: I have to say go with III. Brent?

Scowcroft: Regretfully, I agree.

Kissinger: We will draft you a letter to give to Brezhnev by Saturday.
