SUBJECT: Weekly Report #23, for a three-week period ending January 2, 1976

#### GENERAL CAMPAIGN ORGANIZATION

A preliminary agreement has been reached with Nancy Brataas, Associates for the volunteer telephone activities in New Hampshire and Florida, with the understanding that similar campaigns will be conducted in Massachusetts, Illinois, and North Carolina.

The system is quite comprehensive, combining recruitment, training, and utilization of as many volunteers as possible. Ten phone centers will be established in New Hampshire and twelve in Florida, with ten telephones in each center operating twelve hours a day, six days a week. Ford volunteers will make roughly 85,000 calls in New Hampshire, and 375,000 calls in Florida during a 30-day period prior to the election, which includes a 10-day recruitment blitz and a 3-week voter identification program and a get-outthe-vote effort. Both home phoners and phone-center phoners will be used. Door-to-door precinct operations are coordinated with this program, using a current list of registered voters (GOP and Independents in New Hampshire; GOP only in Florida).

#### STATE CAMPAIGN ORGANIZATIONS

The appointment of Dave LeRoy as Idaho Chairman brings to 40 the number of state organizations established, which includes the District of Columbia and a partial organization in Tennessee.

<u>ALABAMA</u> - Edgar Welden, the GOP Chairman, publicly announced his support for you saying, "As Party Chairman, I intend to work impartially, but my personal choice for the nomination is President Ford who I believe will be a stronger candidate against the Democratic Party nominee in next fall's general election." Edgar made this commitment in spite of considerable pressure from Party members in Alabama.

<u>COLORADO</u> - Former Senator Gordon Allott has agreed to serve on the State Advisory Committee.

<u>IDAHO</u> - Ada County Prosecutor Dave LeRoy has agreed to serve as PFC Chairman, although the official announcement will not be made until mid-January. The 30-year old LeRoy is enthusiastic and has good ideas about the PFC organization for the State. Bill Campbell, whom we had previously asked to be PFC Chairman but who declined for personal reasons, has agreed to work closely with LeRoy.

MONTANA - An RNC poll taken last month in Cascade County (Great Falls), the second largest metropolitan area in the State, showed your approval rating at 46.1%, down ten points from a similar March poll.

NORTH CAROLINA - Eight of the State's eleven Congressional Districts are organized, as are 33 of the 100 counties. There have been 28 priority counties identified, and 23 of these have County Chairmen who are assembling Steering Committees.

Your support here includes the Governor, Congressman Martin, and Congressman Broyhill, as well as most of the legislative delegation, although several (including Jim Broyhill) do not want to be publicly announced. Eleven of the state's Republican sheriffs support you, two of whom hold county leadership positions for us. Only one sheriff has declared for Reagan, and two remain undecided.

Reagan's organization has a statewide Citizens for Reagan Committee, which includes several former and one active member of the State Legislature. There were few surprises here, and only one County Chairman has been announced to date. However, there has been a noticeable increase in activity over the past several weeks.

<u>OREGON</u> - While Secretary of State, Clay Myers, is supporting you, he presently intends to put John Connally on the ballot here. The Secretary of State can put whomever he wishes on it, and their names cannot be withdrawn.

A recent Oregon poll released by Bardsley-Haslacher, a reputable polling firm in the area, showed:

Ford	43%
Reagan	42%
Undecided	15%

<u>WASHINGTON</u> -- At a recent Republican Executive Committee meeting a vote regarding the site selection for the State Convention came down to a Ford-Reagan test with the PFC favoring Spokane over Seattle. Spokane was selected by a 41-24 vote.

#### ISSUES

<u>COMMON SITUS</u>. As expected, your veto of this bill was widely acclaimed, with many of our people saying this shows your ability to make tough decisions.

ENERGY. A much less negative reaction was felt as a result of your signing this legislation than at first anticipated, although your common situs veto helped to offset some of the potential problems. A handful of County Chairmen resigned and the feeling in Texas, Wyoming, Oklahoma and a few other States is still strong; but the general consensus (even in the fund-raising area) is that things will cool down.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

The last three weeks in December proved to be some of our best, raising \$141,637, \$105,063 and \$86,283.83 respectively. Georgia was first to reach the half-way mark with 51.2% of quota, but was quickly topped by Alaska with 61%. (See Treasurer's Reports attached at TAB A.)

The PFC received \$374,422 in matching funds from the Treasury Department, with an additional request for \$119,000 to be submitted to the FEC on January 5. Requests for matching funds can only be made on the first and third Mondays of a month, with the FEC's ruling due within 15 days.

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE

The first report to PFC Finance Chairmen was mailed this weekend. Similar reports, along with a State ranking list, will be sent each week and will be attached as a regular addendum to this report. (See TAB B.) WEEKLY REPORT #23

#### FINANCE COMMITTEE (Continued)

O. C. Carmichael has agreed to serve on the Finance Executive Committee, and Thaddeus Beal has accepted as Finance Co-Chairman in Massachusetts.

On the negative side, Bill Verity, Jr., a member of the Executive Committee and Chairman of the Board of ARMCO Steel, resigned following your signing of the energy bill.

Also, General Leif Sverdrup, our Missouri Finance Chairman, died on New Year's Eve.
