It appears evident at this time you will be elevated to the job of President. I heartily welcome this move. But, more than anything else I would like to convey to you the hope that your administration will become the hallmark of reconciliation. We talk a great deal about "peace in our time", but we tend to forget about the need for an internal peace at home. It would be my hope that your administration would deal with the latter question.

I think it is evident that no organization nor the news media caused Watergate. It was the President and his appointed colleagues. In the days ahead, it is very likely that the President is going to need some assistance from the nation through its political institutions that he will not be criminally prosecuted. I personally hope that such forgiveness will be granted. I think that is one sign of a tolerant and understanding society. However, I think that understanding must also be granted to those who made a decision not to go to war. I know that you personally do not support such a policy. But, forgiveness cannot be limited to one person when it is politically convenient and denied to others when it is politically inconvenient.

It was the founder of our party who brought this nation together after a difficult struggle with the policy of "charity for all." I pray that that philosophy will become a cornerstone of your administration.

On another note, it would also be my hope that your administration would consider appointing Elliot Richardson as its Vice President Page 2 Vice President Ford

and Leon Jaworski as Attorney General. This would represent a giant step forward in terms of bringing integrity and competency back to our national government.

Again, I want to extend my best wishes to you as well as my prayers for an administration that will truly bring together all of our people.
