EXECUTIVE BRANCH POSITION

Foreign Aid Appropriations Bill

General

--Although the Senate Appropriations Committee version of H.R. 4592 is \$2,082,123,927 less than the President's budget estimate--a reduction of 35%--the Executive Branch strongly urges support of the bill and a favorable vote on passage.

--Projects will have to be cut, and other programs reduced, but the Executive Branch welcomes the return to operations under full legislation rather than a continuing resolution.

--Nevertheless, two critical areas require amendment.

Food and Nutrition

--The Food and Nutrition cut of \$150,000,000--a reduction of 30%--is one the United States, and the World, cannot afford. Our efforts to assist in this first priority of the developing world will be severely retarded.

--We must deliver on the commitment of the American people made at the World Food Conference.

--An amendment of \$100,000,000 is required--to raise the Food and Nutrition level to \$450,000,000.

Military Assistance (MAP)


--\$408 million is already obligated or reserved under the continuing resolution, which provides funding at a rate of \$550 million.

--The Administration's efforts to achieve a settlement in the Middle East will be seriously hampered since the planned \$100 million program for Jordan cannot be met.

--It will not be possible to re-establish a program for Turkey which would provide a possible incentive for the resolution of the Cyprus conflict.

--All planning for remaining programs, based upon the \$550 million current rate under the continuing resolution and the \$600 million authorized by the Congress, would be severely disrupted. The level of \$450 million would require a one-third reduction in programs in support of foreign policy and security objectives. The injury to these important U.S. interests would far outweigh any benefit from the proposed cut.

--An amendment of \$100,000,000 is required--to raise the Military Assistance level to \$550,000,000.

Summary of Tentative Appropriations Committee Schedule, 94th Congress, 2nd Session,
As Set Forth in the Memorandum from the Chairman, dated November 5, 1975.

Consistent with the schedule established by the Congressional Budget Act, the Chairman's memorandum provides that House consideration of all 13 regular appropriation bills be completed by July 2, 1976. This allows a period of 24 weeks after Congress convenes on January 6, 1976. This period consists of 120 week days, which in turn consists of 11 recess days, and 109 non-recess days. The 109 non-recess days consist of 68 Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and 41 Mondays and Fridays.

The schedule set forth in the Chairman's memorandum is as follows:

- Jan 6 Congress convenes.
- Jan 19 President submits his budget.
- Jan 26 Start subcommittee hearings. Go through April 9. Provides 11 weeks, minus 2 recess days (Lincoln's Birthday).
- Jan 27-28 Budget Overview hearings.
- Feb 2 Subcommittees begin preparation of our Committee's report to the House Budget Committee, on our Committee's views and estimates on amounts within our jurisdiction. Subcommittees complete action by February 17.
- Feb. 12-13 Lincoln Day Recess.
- March 1 Submit report to House Budget Committee.
- April 15 House reports first concurrent resolution on the budget. The Congressional Budget Act provides that the conference report on the budget resolution contain an allocation of budget authority and outlays by committee, and that the Appropriations Committee of each House shall, after consultation, allocate their totals by subcommittee. However, preliminary allocations will be based on the House-passed budget resolution.
- April 15-25 Easter recess.
- April 26 Start subcommittee markup. Go through May 7. Provides 10 days for 13 markups. Subcommittees that finish hearings early may markup early.
- May 24 Start full committee consideration. Go through June 4. Provides 8 days for 13 bills. The Congressional Budget Act requires that prior to reporting the first regular appropriation bill, subcommittee and full committee action on each bill shall, to the extent practicable, be completed, and the Committee shall report to the House its recommendations to those in the budget resolution. Work on this report would begin during full committee consideration.
- May 28-31 Memorial Day Recess.
- June 7 Report to House comparing Committee recommendations with budget resolution.
- June 15-
July 2 Floor consideration. Provides 14 days for 13 bills, and whatever rules may be necessary.

In addition, the Chairman's memorandum: raises the possibility of a task force, smaller than the full committee, to conduct the overview hearings (p.3); notes the problem of printing hearings, and asks whether justifications could be printed early and in separate volumes (p.5); notes additional reporting requirements (p.7); and notes that next year's schedule will be further complicated by bills left over from this year, a supplemental, the Tuesday to Thursday phenomenon, primaries, and rescissions, and referral to the Committee of entitlement legislation (pp. 9-10).

The Chairman of the House Appropriations Committee met with relevant Subcommittee Chairmen yesterday and it was agreed that there should be a separate appropriations bill to fund the public works jobs authorization bill which was enacted over the President's veto.

The State/Justice/Commerce Appropriations Subcommittee will meet tomorrow at 10:00 to mark-up the public works title of the bill and the HUD Subcommittee will meet on Thursday and Friday mornings to mark-up the EPA and countercyclical sections of the bill. (It is interesting to note that the countercyclical section of the bill was referred to Boland's HUD Subcommittee instead of Steed's Treasury Subcommittee, even though it will be the Treasury Department's Office of Revenue Sharing which will have responsibility for the countercyclical program should it ever be effected).

The full Committee will meet on August 10 and it is expected that they will report out a bill at that time. The Appropriations Committee is thinking about seeking a closed rule in order to try to ensure that the bill is not "Christmas-treed" on the House Floor.

We are beginning to get calls asking for strategy signals from the Administration. Please advise as to how you would like to proceed, because I think we must act quickly to get our troops in line. From what we now hear, Commerce is gearing up to write regulations to run the program without giving any thought, it would appear, toward opposing the appropriations bill. Perhaps a meeting of appropriate Administration players should be called in the very near future.
