

Governor Hugh Carey called regarding the situation involving the City of New York, which he feels is so severe and so immediate that he believes it is essential he and the Mayor meet with you as promptly as possible.

This was a matter that was discussed this morning at the Senior Staff meeting, and I am of the view that it might be helpful to meet with them, hear their case, and then explain why the federal government cannot be more responsive, if that is your view.

Inasmuch as they have already met with your senior officials, and still demand a meeting, I believe it's difficult to turn down such a request from the Governor of New York and the Mayor of New York City.
