THE PRESIDENT HAS SEE THE WHITE HOUSE WASHINGTON Dictated by Phone from Detroit Monday, June 9, 1975

Dear Mr. President:

I wanted to send you my congratulations on your trip to Europe; I think it was a real diplomatic success, and you have every reason to be pleased with it.

I also wanted to let you know that I have been keeping in touch with the Israelis, and I have reason to hope that there will be a very positive response from your meetings this week with the Prime Minister.

I am leaving for Israel Friday night for a week in my capacity as Chairman of the World Wide Jewish Agency, which is composed of representative leadership of America and the rest of the world. During that time I might be able to spend some time in the area on some appropriate diplomatic efforts. In this regard, I have talked with Secretary Kissinger and have set up a meeting with him for Friday at 10:30 a.m. Set Ms.

Depending on your own wishes, I thought it might be useful for me to meet with you at the same time, or to otherwise get your thoughts on how I could be of help to you during my visit to Israel. I will be in Washington from Thursday afternoon through noon on Friday.
