Jack's friend from Breckinsidge, I believe her name was Tim Weed, although I may be mistaken, deserver considerable credit. He was always abet to the med to keep Jack circulating and I would say he worked extremely hard at trying to get Jack introduced to the uncommitted delegates. much of Jack's success was do to Tim's efforts.

The Secret Service agents assigned to Jack also deserve recognition and praise. I had plenty of apportunity to observe them during their stay. They maintained an unobtrusive efficient protective presence. Not once did I see them interfere with Jack's movements. They were politically alreased and never condessending.
