Senator Kennedy will probably offer a motion for recommittal of the Tax Bill. Senator Tower has suggested that such action may be advantageous.

We consulted Secretary Simon. He suggests that we should not take a position on the recommittal matter; but instead should let the Democrats take full responsibility for actions on the Bill.

He is concerned that you will be blamed for stopping "tax reform" if you overtly support the recommittal initiative.

Mr. Greenspan and OMB concur with Secretary Simon.
