Onassis: Memories Of an Insomniac

Quotes and notes from Washington parties, uncover-ed by Ymelda Dixon for The Washington Star:

James Lee Auchincloss, the 28-year-old half-brother of Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, was reminiscing Saturday night about Aristotle Onassis, who had died earlier that day in Paris.

Onassis' death came "as a shock to us," said Jamie Auchincloss at a party in the home of television interviewer Deena Clark. "But oddly, yester-day I thought to myself about beware the Ides of March.' Onassis and Caesar were alike; both built empires."

Auchincloss said he had met the late Greek shipping czar twice.

"Onassis was an insomniac, and I remember Jamie Auchincloss thinking that in his position, insomnia was helpful," Auchincloss recalled. "When everyone else was asleep, he would call Europe and other places where it was day-time, and conduct his business."

One extra unfortunate aspect of Onassis' death was noted by Auchincloss.

"Now there will be wild speculation about whom

Jackie will marry this time, and it's so ridiculous; there's no necessity for her to marry at all," he said.

Peter Malatesta, the former aide to former Vice President Spiro Agnew, and a prominent party-giver, gave one yesterday for Korean industrialist Tongsun Park in honor of Park's 40th birthday.

Malatesta normally likes to cook, but he didn't feel up to it, "so I just had the whole thing catered by Yenching Palace," he said.

Archbishop William Baum went to a St. Patrick's Day party given yesterday at the Sheraton-Carlton Hotel by retiring hotelier Charles Carey. The archbishop used the opportunity to compare the way Washington observes St. Pat's Day with the way it is observed elsewhere.

"It's warm and vibrant. certainly not like New York City, but certainly more enthusiastic than St. Patrick's in the Midwest," he said.
