PRESIDENT FORD just sent out 3,500 holiday cards, and the one I got included a personal Christmas letter: "To all our close friends, wherever you are: Seasons greetings from 'Chez Ford!' Well, it was a real busy year here at 1600 Pennsylvania Ave., where so much has happened to us all since we last wrote everybody.

"I like the new job a lot, although it does take me away from home. It's more relaxing work than what I did before as a mid-western sales rep, but there's quite a bit more responsibility, too. I hope to grow into the job gradually and in a few years I'll know just what's expected of me. It's a challenge, anyway.

"When I took this new position, I sure didn't think I'd enjoy it, even though it pays more and you're allowed to be your 'own man.' I like not having to kowtow to anybody anymore and they let me get in all the skiing I want.

The painting, done in 1858, is part of the White House collection and hangs in the Green Room. The card has a red border and was designed and made by Hallmark Cards, who also made Christmas cards for Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson and Nixon.




