Lawrence Zupan, senior consultant in Ophthalmology, told The Code Authority that all eye drop warnings should be: 'Redness of the eye is a warning sign of disease. If redness persists, stop using the drops.'

And Cynthia Margolin, director of the National Prevention of Blindness, said that the destructive processes caused by over-the-counter eye drops can be devastating.

The FDA's deputy director of consumer affairs, Dr. Mark Novich, said that the possibility of eye damage is warned about by Dr. Mindell in his book on the overuse of self-medication.
