PHILIP WARDEN Biographical Data

Mr. Philip Warden has served as a Congressional correspondent for the Chicago Tribune since 1957. He joined the Chicago Tribune in March, 1940 as a reporter on its business news page.

Mr. Warden has covered the Administrations of seven Presidents beginning with Franklin Roosevelt through President Ford. He covered Truman's campaign for re-election in 1948 and later went with the President on a visit to Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. He accompanied President Truman to Wake Island for his historic meeting with General Douglas MacArthur.

In 1944 he began almost full time coverage of the trial of thirty-two persons charged with a wartime sedition, before being transferred to the Washington bureau of the Tribune in September of 1942.

He was born on November 3, 1912 in Trenton, Missouri. He received his A.B. from Park College in Parkville, Missouri, in 1934 and his Journalism Degree from the University of Missouri in 1936. He served as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy from June 1944 until April 1946.

Mr. Warden resides in Alexandria, Virginia.
