NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President today accepted with regret and with grateful appreciation for her service, the resignation of Sister Mary Emil, of Monroe, Michigan, as a Member of the Commission on Presidential Scholars. She was appointed on April 28, 1969.

The President today accepted with deep regret and with appreciation for his dedicated service, the resignation of Dr. Frederic H. Kellogg, of Memphis, Tennessee, as a Member of the Mississippi River Commission. He was appointed on November 6, 1965.

The President today accepted with a special sense of regret the resignation of Thomas K. Glennan, Jr., as Director of the National Institute of Education, effective November 1, 1974. He was appointed to this position on October 31, 1972 and was the first Director of the Institute.

The President today accepted with regret the resignation of Brian P. Gettings as United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia. Mr. Gettings first became a United States Attorney for the Eastern District in May of 1969 and was reappointed in June of 1973.

The President today accepted with regret and with appreciation for his dedicated service, the resignation of Anthony J. P. Farris of Houston, Texas, as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Texas. He was appointed on June 20, 1969.

The President today acknowledged with appreciation for his distinguished contributions, the retirement of Walter E. Hoffman as a United States District Judge for the Eastern District of Virginia, effective September 3, 1974. He was appointed on July 15, 1954.
