Mr. Ford was overheard to say at one point during the tour, "It's a beautiful job of restoration and preservation."

A bit later, he was shown the ramparts of an ancient city wall that he was told had been rebuilt twice after being destroyed in both world wars one and two.

A metal statue of a mermaid which survived both periods of destruction was pointed out to the President and he remarked, "It pays to be a mermaid."

The tour of the old town lasted about 15 minutes. Mr. Ford did some, hand-shaking, pausing one time to chat for a moment with some eight to 10 year old girls in Scout-type uniforms.

Mr. Ford then went back to his car and the motorcade took a 20 minute drive through downtown Warsaw and a large park.

Along some of that route, crowds were gathered on sidewalks as Mr. Ford passed by. Dick Cheney told us later the tour had been a sight seeing excursion. Your pool was excused when Mr. Ford left his car and entered the Parliment Building for the signing ceremony.
