attention was baseball player Henry Aaron. The President also spoke animatedly with Aaron for almost a minute.

After receiving the guests, the President and Mrs. Ford and the Emperer and Empress turned and looked at three of the Empress five paintaings, and a few of the others, before going into dinner in the Commons.

After dinner, they recumed their inspection of the art,

saw the other two paintaings by the Empress and several more
objects. They accommodated photographers by observing some
of the paintaings they had already seen before departing.
