The President today announced his intention to nominate Peter D. Walther, of Malvern, Pennsylvania, to be a member of the National Labor Relations Board for a term expiring August 27, 1980. He will succeed Ralph E. Kennedy who resigned effective July 30, 1975.

Since 1962, Mr. Walther has been a partner in the law firm of Morgan, Lewis, and Bockius in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. From 1955 to 1962, he was an attorney with the National Labor Relations Board serving in the Detroit and Philadelphia field offices. During 1954 to 1955, he was in the private practice of law in Quantico, Virginia.

Mr. Walther was born on June 5, 1928, in Elizabeth, New Jersey. He attended the University of Virginia and received his B. A. degree in 1950 and his LL.B. in 1952. He is a member of the American Bar Association.

Mr. Walther is married to the former Bettie Patrick and they have two children.
