The Presidential motorcade departed auditorium 11:10 a. m., five inutes ahead of schedule, arriving at the Marriott near the Hotel, seven minutes later. Ron Nessen, attempting to hitch a ride in a wire car, was evicted by the driver. Protest that trip was non-political fre was to no avail.

Ford was greeted at the hotel by Joseph Fogarty, a Miami businessman, who has organized local Ford supporters in the business community to raise campaign funds. The President mingled with 75 persons for about 15 minutes.

entered.
