THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Clement B. Malin, of Falls Church, Virginia, to be an Assistant Administrator of the Federal Energy Administration. His area of responsibility will be International Energy Affairs. He will succeed Melvin Conant who resigned effective February 20, 1976. Mr. Malin has been acting Assistant Administrator for International Energy Affairs since February, 1976.

Born on April 4, 1934, in Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania, Mr. Malin received his A.B. degree from Dartmouth College in 1956. He attended Princeton University and was awarded his M.P.A. in 1960.

In July, 1960, Mr. Malin joined the Mobil Oil Company as Projects Assistant. He was a junior Planning Assistant from 1961 to 1963; a Planning Advisor in Paris, France from 1963 to 1965; Planning Manager in the Netherlands from 1965 to 1967; Planning Coordinator for Mobil Europe in London, England from 1967 to 1969; Planning Manager for Mobil Latin American from 1969 to 1971 and Projects Planning Manager for Mobil South in New York from July, 1971 to July, 1973. He became Assistant to the Area Manager in August, 1973.

Mr. Malin joined the Federal Energy Administration as Chief of the Producer Country Organizations for International Energy Affairs at FEA in February, 1974. He became Deputy Assistant Administrator for International Energy Affairs in June, 1974.

Mr. Malin and his wife, Ann, reside in Falls Church, Virginia.
