The President today announced his intention to nominate Richard B. Ogilvie, of Chicago, Illinois, to be a member of the Board of Directors of the U.S. Railway Association for the remainder of a term expiring July 8, 1976. He will succeed William B. Scranton who resigned effective March 15, 1976. The President today also announced his intention to nominate Mr. Ogilvie for a term expiring July 8, 1982. He has been an attorney with the firm of Isham, Lincoln and Beale in Chicago since 1973.

Born on February 22, 1923, in Kansas City, Missouri, Mr. Ogilvie received his B.A. degree from Yale University in 1947 and his J.D. degree from the Chicago-Kent College School of Law in 1949. He is a member of the Illinois Bar.

Mr. Ogilvie was in the private practice of law from 1950 to 1962, and during that time was Assistant U.S. Attorney in Chicago during 1954-55 and was Special Assistant to the U.S. Attorney General in Chicago from 1958 to 1961. He served as Sheriff of Cook County from 1962 to 1966. He was elected Governor of the State of Illinois in 1968.

Mr. Ogilvie is married to the former Dorothy Shriver and they have one daughter.
