NOTICE TO THE PRESS

The President and Chancellor Schmidt met for 90 minutes this morning following the South Grounds arrival ceremony. FRG Foreign Minister Genscher, Dr. Jurgen Ruhfus, Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Federal Chancellery, Secretary of State Kissinger and Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs Brent Scowcroft participated in this morning's meeting.

At the outset of the meeting, their eighth in 20 months, the President and the Chancellor agreed that close and continuing consultations between the United States and the Federal Republic since 1974 have contributed importantly to our excellent bilateral relations and to economic recovery, a stronger Atlantic Alliance and a more stable peace.

The President and the Chancellor devoted attention this morning to international economic developments, focusing in particular on the positive results of the recent economic summit meeting in Puerto Rico. In this connection, they discussed progress in implementing agreements reached there to maintain growth without generating new inflation, to improve cooperation on international economic problems, and to advance the dialogue between the developed and developing nations. In this regard the Chancellor informed the President of the results of the recent summit of the European Communities.

This morning's meeting included a review of issues of current importance to the Atlantic Alliance. The President and the Chancellor also exchanged views on developments in East-West relations including SALT.

The President expressed the gratitude of the American people for the many generous gifts and contributions of the Federal Republic in commemoration of our Bicentennial, including the Einstein Spacearium at the Air and Space Museum -- which Chancellor Schmidt will inaugurate this afternoon.

The President and the Chancellor will meet again tomorrow morning.

The President will give a State Dinner for Chancellor Schmidt this evening in the White House.
