## THE WHITE HOUSE

The President today announced his intention to nominate three persons to be members of the Board of Directors of the National Institute of Building Sciences. These are new positions created by Public Law 93-383 of August 22, 1974, and consists of not less than fifteen members and not more than twenty-one members appointed by the President. They are:

Ernest Ambler, of Bethesda, Maryland, Acting Director, National Bureau of Standards, Washington, D. C. This is for a term of two years.

Charles J. Orlebeke, of Bethesda, Maryland, Assistant Secretary of Housing and Urban Development for Policy Development and Research, Washington, D. C. This is for a term of three years.

Jack C. Sanders, of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, State Fire Marshal, State of Oklahoma, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. This is for a term of one year.

The purpose of the Institute is to develop and encourage the adoption of performance criteria for building components.
