The President went to Moore and Moore Lithographers, Inc. in Northeast Washington to talk with workers there. the plant employs about 75 people. A group of about 18 pressmen gathered around for a sort of round table chat with the President.

The wife of the president of the printing company, Mrs. Cupples said they asked the President questions about taxes and Earl Butz, and crime. When asked what the President said about Butz, she said Mr. Ford said he was merely telling a story from some time ago, that he does not condone it, and that he punished him very severely.

Mr. Ford was in the plant for a little more than an hour. The exchange with the workers was xxxx being filmed by the P.F.C. presumably for future campaign spots.
