Synopsis: Applicant's father, LESLIE KING, was in real estate business, Riverton, Wyoming, for many years until 1938, but now deceased. Reputation and morals considered excellent; no arrest record; satisfactory credit record, Riverton, Wyoming; no indication of un-American tendencies.

DETAILS: AT DENVER, COLORADO

R. E. SLAGLE, Chief of Police, Riverton, Wyoming, was telephonically communicated with and he advised "that Applicant's father, LESLIE KING, was the proprietor of the KING INVESTMENT COMPANY, a real estate agency, for many years prior to 1938. Chief SLAGLE stated that Applicant's father traveled at that time and did not stay any length of time at one place, and that he died several months later after returning to Riverton. He stated that he had known Applicant's father during the time that he was in Riverton, Wyoming, and was of the opinion that his character, reputation and morals were excellent; that he had not heard anything against him, and further that there was no arrest record on Applicant's father in Riverton. He stated that he had ascertained from the merchants in Riverton that Applicant's father's credit record was satisfactory.

Chief SLAGLE stated that he was positive that Applicant's father had no un-American tendencies.

Two persons state affiliated with COMMITTEE for same reason. All agree war changed isolationist opinions. All persons state Applicant and family 100% Americans and free from subversive tendencies or sympathies. Parents, LESLIE KING and DOROTHY GARDNER KING divorced Omaha, Nebraska, 1914 or 1915. GERALD RUDOLPH FORD at Grand Rapids, February 1, 1917. Present address of LESLIE KING unknown, but last heard from May 23, 1938, from Riverton, Wyoming, and once in 1939 from Lincoln, Nebraska. Applicant no credit record; step-father excellent one. No criminal records for Applicant or family. Applicant's draft classification I-B, unchanged after review December 9; 1941. All persons state Applicant willing to be inducted if called, and not filing application to avoid military service.

Details:

AT GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mr. SHERMAN E. CORYELL, 1332 Giddings Avenue, S.E., Principal, South High School, 120 Hall Street, S.E., produced the records of Applicant's attendance at that School from the Fall of 1927 until graduation on June 19, 1931, which indicated a four year_average of 89.58. Mr. CORYELL stated that this average would place Applicant in the upper fourth of his class, on the basis of which he was elected to membership in the National Honor Society. The records gave Applicant's birth as July 14, 1913, at Omaha, Nebraska. They also indicated the Applicant's election by his fellow students to the School's Student Council, and his election by it to the Inter-Hi Council, composed of representatives from all High Schools in the City. The records further showed Applicant's participation in the following activities: Glee Club, Latin Club, Football Team (Captain his Senior year), Basketball Team and Track Team. Mr. CORYELL advised that there is no record of any disciplinary action having been



taken against Applicant.

Mr. CORYELL stated that he had not been connected with South High School during "pplicant's attendance there, but that he was familiar with Applicant's outstanding record. He advised that Applicant was "one man in a School generation," and that he is considered one of South High School's outstanding alumni.

Mr. AFTHUR W. KRAUSE, 910 Giddings Avenue, S.E., Superintendent of Public Shools, 143 Bostwick Avenue, N.E., advised that he had been Principal of South High School while Applicant was in attendance there. "e stated that Applicant was a conscientious student, who had been extremely popular with his fellow students and also highly regarded by his teachers. Mr. KRAUSE said that during Applicant's term as football captain, as well as during his membership on the Student Council, he had demonstrated leadership ability which was outstanding in a boy of his age. "e also advised that Applicant had given striking evidence of his ability to "keep his mouth shut."

Mr. KRAUSE stated that he has been well acquainted with Applicant ever since his High School days, and considers him to be excellent material for any Government position. He also stated that he knows the reputation of Applicant and his entire family to be excellent, and that they are free and clear from any un-American or subversive tendencies.

Mr. HOWARD W. WICKETT, 1644 Jefferson Avenue, S.E., Apartment 2, Principal Creston High School, 1676 Plainfield Avenue, N.W., advised that he had been Applicant's session room teacher at South High School, as well as faculty Manager of athletics during the period of Applicant's attendance at that School. Mr. WICKETT stated that Applicant had made a splendid record both scholastically and athletically while at High School, and had been selected, in his Senior year, as Center of the All-State High School football team. He characterized Applicant as a clean boy of good habits, good looking in appearance, and alert not only in class, but on the athletic field.

Mr. WICKETT stated that the reputation of Applicant and of his family is above reproach, and that none of them hold any subversive tendencies so far as he knows or has heard. He advised that he would have no hesitation in recommending Applicant for any position for which he had the technical qualifications.

In the Office of the County Clerk of Kent County, Michigan, is contained, in Marriage Record Volume 18, Page 179, No. 4165, a record of the marriage at Grand Rapids, by C.O. GRIESHABER, Clergyman, on February 1, 1917, of GERALD RUDOLPH FORD and DOROTHY GARDINER KING. Such record contains the notation that the bride had been married once before, without designating the manner in which such former marriage was terminated. Applicant advised that such former marriage had terminated in a divorce, decreed in Omaha, Nebraska, in 1914 or 1915.

The records of the Probate Court of Kent County indicate that on December 3, 1935, on Petition of the Applicant, a Decree, No. 59424, was entered by JOHN DALTON, Probate Judge, changing Applicant's name from LESLIE KING, JR., to GERALD RUDOLPH FORD, JR. In the file containing the original Decree there is lodged a letter, dated May 23, 1938, from LESLIE KING, of Riverton, Wyoming, making inquiries concerning the proceedings. Applicant advised that he had last heard from his father by letter, received sometime in 1939, which bore no return address, but was postmarked "Lincoln, Nebraska;" and that neither he nor his mother knew the present whereabouts of his father.

EMPLOYMENT

Applicant is a member of the law firm of FORD and BUCHEN, with offices at 621 Michigan Trust Building, S.E. corner of Pearl Street and Ottawa Avenue, N.W. Certificate of Copartnership No. 2300, filed on June 20, 1941, in the Office of the County Clerk of Kent County, Michigan, indicated that the members of that firm are GERALD RUDOLPH FORD, JR., and PHILIP W. BUCHEN.



Mr. ROBERT J. McBAIN, 926 Joslin Street, S.E., Dean, School of Business Administration, University of Grand Rapids, 1607 Robinson Road, S.E., stated that Applicant had been employed last Summer as teacher of law in the School of Business Administration and as Assistant Football Coach. Mr. McBAIN advised that Applicant is a man of excellent personality, who meets people well, and who has shown marked ability as an organizer in preparing the law course to be given during this School year. He stated that Applicant appears to be a good teacher, and is popular with his students, and that he had made a large contribution to the success of last Fall's football season.

Mr. McBAIN stated that he knows Applicant socially, and that he does not use alcohol to excess. He also stated that he considers Applicant to be a 100% American.

REFERENCES

Mr. PAUL G. GOEBEL, 2310 Jefferson Drive, S.E., partner in the sporting goods firm of Goebel and Brown, 12 Monroe Avenue, N.E., stated that he has known Applicant for 18 or 20 years, and is also acquainted with Applicant's family. He said that Applicant is "a splendid young man," popular, and a good mixer, who had made a very good record in High School, at the University of Michigan, and at Yale Law School. Mr. GOEBEL stated that Applicant has temperate habits, does not smoke, drinks rarely and very moderately when he does, and keeps himself in good physical condition. He also stated that, except for injuries to his knees which Applicant had recieved while playing football, Applicant had enjoyed good health.

Mr. GOEBEL further advised that Applicant has a great deal of "drive" and organizing ability. As evidence of the latter, he cited Applicant's achievements in getting a law practice started, as well as the success of "Curbstone Quarterbacks", a series of weekly luncheons for persons interested in football, promoted by Applicant, which "started from scratch" last Fall and built up to an attendance of 400 at one luncheon.

ORIGINAL RETIRED FOR PRESERVATION

Mr. GOEBEL stated that Applicant's mother is a "fine, civic-minded woman," and that his step-father is a civic leader who is very highly regarded in the community. He could give no information concerning Applicant's real father. Mr. GOEBEL said he was certain that Applicant and his entire family had no un-American tendencies, and were loyal Americans.

Mr. GOEBEL further advised that Applicant had spoken to him about Selective Service, and had stated his willingness to go into the army if called, although he felt that his legal training would fit him to serve his country more effectively than as a selectee, and hence he had made Application for employment both by the Office of Naval Intelligence and by the Bureau.

Mr. GOEBEL stated that he would be more than willing to employ Applicant himself, and that, although he made it a practice not to recommend people for jobs, he had no hesitation in recommending Applicant for employment by the Bureau, and did so without any reservation.

Dr. G. HOWARD SOUTHWICK, 1935 San Lu Rae Drive, S.E., East Grand Rapids, physician and surgeon, 55 Sheldon Avenue, S.E., stated that he had known Applicant for about 12 years, and his family even longer. Dr. SOUTHWICK gave substantially the same information about Applicant and his family as Mr. GOEBEL, adding that Applicant is a person of the highest integrity, and that his half-brother, THOMAS FORD, is an Ensign in the United States Navy, presently stationed somewhere on the West Coast.

Mr. THORNE J. BRGWN, 937 Chippewa Drive, S.E., partner in the sporting goods firm of Goebel and Brown, 12 Monroe Avenue, N.W., stated that he had known Applicant for a least 10 years. Mr. BROWN gave approximately the same information concerning Applicant and his family as Mr. GOEBEL and Dr. SOUTHWICK, and characterized him as having "good habits." He was particularly emphatic in his recommendation of Applicant for employment by the Bureau.

Mr. FREDERICK E. STILES, 1310 Franklin Street, S.E., member of the law firm of WILLIAMS, STILES and TUBBS, 538

Michigan Trust Building, S.E. Corner Pearl Street and Ottawa Avenue, N.W., and President, Stiles Incorporated, 155 Eastern Avenue, S.E., stated that he had known Applicant for 7 years and his mother and step-father for 15 or 20 years. Mr. STILES corroborated the statements concerning Applicant and his family made by the three previous references, He also described Applicant as a "fine fellow", who is intelligent and discreet, possessing both drive and ingenuity. Mr. STILES said that he considered Applicant worthy of the highest possible recommendation.

that he has known Applicant and his family for a number of years, since his first association with Applicant's step-father in business. Information concerning Applicant and his family was corroborative of that furnished by the other references.

advised

described applicant as a hard worker, a good mixer, and free from any trace of snobbishness. He advised that he did not believe Applicant had been a member of the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE at Yale University, but of an organization of similar name, which he could not recall, supporting the candidacy of WENDELL WILLKIE for President.

advised that Applicant had held isolationist opinions during the past few years, but that he had changed such opinions following the entry of the United States into the War. He also advised that Applicant had expressed to him willingness to serve his country in any capacity for which he might be called.

NEIGHBORHOOD

AT EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mrs. GEORGE J. HARDY, 1012 Santa Cruz Drive, S.E., whos husband is employed in the shops of the Pere Marquette Rail-

road, advised that she has been a neighbor of the FORD family for the past four years, and is acquainted with all of them except Applicant, whom she knows barely to speak to because of him having been away from home until recently. She stated that the family are "splendid" people, and that Applicant's brothers, RICHARD and JAMES, who are in School, are well-behaved boys who cause no trouble in the neighborhood. Mrs. HARDY said that she had never heard any scandal concerning any member of the FORD family, or any rumor of their making un-American or subversive statements or having any such tendencies.

The following persons, when interviewed, stated that they had each known Applicant's family for about two years, and gave substantially the same information as Mrs. HARDY:

Mrs. RICHARD J. ELIAS, 1016 Santa Cruz Drive, S.E., whose husband is a dentist, with offices at 744 Franklin Street, S.E., Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Mrs. RUSSEL A. SWANEY, 1017 Santa Cruz Drive, S.E., whose husband is Secretary-Treasurer of Harper, Wegusen and Yonkman, Inc., 104 Federal Square Building, 29-33 Pearl Street, North West, Grand Rapids, investments.

Mrs. HAROLD J. DAMSTRA, 1022 Santa Cauz Drive, S.E., whose husband is a physician, with offices at 1115 Wealthy Street, S.E., Grand Rapids.

Mrs. BERNARD S. WARREN, 1025 Santa Cruz Drive, stated that she had resided in the neighborhood only a short time and could give no information about Applicant or his family.

AT GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

stated that he has known Applicant for 8 years, having been a Fraternity brother, Delta Kappa Epsilon, of Applicant's

at the University of Michigan. He characterized Applicant as a "swell fellow," entirely trustworthy, whose word is entitled to absolute reliance, having no bad habits, and being only an occasional moderate drinker.

stated that Applicant, while attending the University of Michigan, had held the view, shared by many of his contemporaries, that war is entirely futile as a means of settling anything, and was strongly set against taking part in any war which might occur in the future. He stated that out of these views. Applicant evolved an adherence to the isolationist viewpoint when the present War began and aid to Britain was advocated. He further stated that, motivated by his isolationist viewpoint, Applicant joined the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE when it was first organized at Yale University by two of Applicant's friends in the law school. advised he was convinced that Applicant had adhered to the COMMITTEE with pure motives, and not with any subversive intent. He further stated that, when the authorities of Yale University suggested to Applicant that it was embarrasing for the University to have him, while a member of the football coaching staff, active on the COMMITTEE, Applicant promptly severed all connection with the COMMITTEE; and that shortly afterward, Applicant became associated with the WFIKIE Organization and worked hard organizing WILKIE-for-President Clubs in Colleges and Universities throughout the country.

advised that he has known Applicant since they were in grade school together. He said that he and Applicant had gone to different High Schools, but had been together at the University of Michigan, where Applicant belonged to the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity. (described Applicant as having good moral fibre, no bad habits, and being a good organizer.

tion as about Applicant's connection with the AMERICA

FIRST COMMITTEE, except that he doubted Applicant's having been one of the organizers at Yale University. He corroborated in his statement that Applicant's connection with the COMMITTEE had been due to his isolationist viewpoint rather than to any subversive tendencies, and stated that in his opinion Applicant is a loyal American. Stated that he would recommend Applicant without reservation for a position with the Bureau.

stated that he stated that he

gave substantially the same information about Applicant and his family as the references, named above, and corroborated statements concerning Applicant's connection with the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE and his motives in such connection.

AT EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mr. ALLAN ELLIOTT, Grandville, Michigan, teacher and athletic coach, East Grand Rapids High School, 2021 Lake Drive, S.E., stated that he has known Applicant since they were both youngsters, having gone to both Junior and Senior High School, and played on the same teams, with Applicant. Mr. ELLIOTT said that Applicant is a good, clean sport of temperate habits, and is an excellent organizer, as he has seen from contact with Applicant in the work of the Grand Rapids Junior Association of Commerce, of which they are both members. He also said that even as a boy, particularly on various athletic teams, Applicant showed outstanding leadership ability.

Mr. ELLIOTT advised that Applicant's two halfbrothers, RICHARD and JAMES, attend East Grand Rapids High School where he has had an opportunity to observe them, and that neither

has ever been the subject of disciplinary action.

Mr. ELLIOTT stated his conviction that Applicant had no un-American sympathies or tendencies, and of Applicant's absolute loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. DONALD T. MAENTZ, 933 Orchare Road. S.E., whose husband is a salesman, stated that she had known Applicant for a number of years, and had attended the University of Michigan while Applicant was matriculating there. She said he is a "swell fellow," entirely free from subversive tendencies, and very highly regarded by the group of men and women of his own age who constitute his closest friends. Mrs. MAENTZ advised that, although she has frequently attended social functions at which Applicant was present, both at the University and in Grand Rapids, she has never seen him drink to excess.

Mr. HOWARD R. DAVIDSON, JR., 942 Dickinson Street, S.E., member of the firm of HOWARD R. DAVIDSON Co. 1480 Buchanan Avenue, S.E., sales agents, stated that he has known Applicant since the days they attended grade school together, and that "they don't come any finer" than Applicant. Mr. DAVIDSON made substantially the same statements concerning Applicant as those made by his references and by other disinterested persons.

CREDIT

Mr. WILLIAM J. BOMKEMA, official of Merchants Service Bureau, 309-321 Federal Square Building, 29-33 Pearl Street, N.W., Grand Rapids, Michigan, advised that Applicant had no credit record with the Bureau, but that Applicant's step-father, GERALD RUDOLPH FORD, had an excellent credit rathing. Mr. ROMKEMA also advised that he is personally acquainted with Applicant's step-father, who has a fine reputation in the community, and is very active in all types of civic enterprises.

DETAILS:

AT GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mr. SHERMAN E. CORYELL, 1332 Giddings Avenue, S.E., Principal, South High School, 120 Hall Street, S.E., produced the records of Applicant's attendance at that School from the Fall of 1927 until graduation on June 19, 1931, which indicated a four year average of 89.58. Mr. CORYELL stated that this average would place Applicant in the upper fourth of his class, on the basis of which he was elected to membership in the National Honor Society. The records gave Applicant's birth as July 14, 1913, at Omaha, Nebraska. They also indicated the Applicant's election by his fellow students to the School's Student Council, and his election by it to the Inter-Hi Council, composed of representatives from all High Schools in the City. The records further showed Applicant's participation in the following activities: Glee Club, Latin Club, Football Team (Captain his Senior year), Basketball Team and Track Team. Mr. CORYELL advised that there is no record of any disciplinary action having been taken against Applicant.

Mr. CORYELL stated that he had not been connected with South High School during Applicant's attendance there, but that he was familiar with Applicant's outstanding record. He advised that Applicant was "one man in a School generation," and that he is considered one of South High School's outstanding alumni.

Mr. ARTHUR W. KRAUSE, 910 Giddings Avenue, S.E., Superintendent of Public Schools, 143 Bostwick Avenue, N.E., advised that he had been Principal of South High School while Applicant was in attendance there. He stated that Applicant was a conscientious student, who had been extremely popular with his fellow students and also highly regarded by his teachers. Mr. KRAUSE said that during Applicant's term as football captain, as well as during his membership on the Student Council, he had demonstrated leadership ability which was outstanding in a boy of his age. He also advised that Applicant had given striking evidence of his ability to "keep his mouth shut."

Mr. KRAUSE stated that he has been well acquainted with Applicant ever since High School days, and considers him to be excellent material for any Government position. He also stated that he knows the reputation of Applicant and his entire family to be excellent, and that they are free and clear from any un-American or subversive tendencies.

Mr. HOWARD W. WICKETT, 1644 Jefferson Avenue, S.E., Apartment 2, Principal Creston High School, 1676 Plainfield Avenue, N.W., advised that he had been Applicant's session room teacher at South High School, as well as faculty Manager of athletics during the period of Applicant's attendance at that School. Mr. WICKETT stated that Applicant had made a splendid record both scholastically and athletically while at High School, and had been selected in his Senior year, as Center of the All-State High School football team. He characterized Applicant as a clean boy of good habits, good looking in appearance, and alert not only in class, but on the athletic field.

Mr. WICKETT stated that the reputation of Applicant and of his family is above reproach, and that none of them hold any subversive tendencies so far as he knows or has heard. He advised that he would have no hesitation in recommending Applicant for any position for which he had the technical qualifications.

In the Office of the County Clerk of Kent County, Michigan, is contained, in Marriage Record Volume 18, Page 179, No. 4165, a record of the marriage at Grand Rapids, by C. O. GRIESHABER, Clergyman, on February 1, 1917, of GERALD RUDOLPH FORD and DOROTHY GARDINER KING. Such record contains the notation that the bride had been married once before, without designating the manner in which such former marriage was terminated. Applicant advised that such former marriage had terminated in a divorce, decreed in Omaha, Nebraska, in 1914, or 1915.

The records of the Probate Court of Kent County indicate that on December 3, 1935, on Petition of the Applicant, a Decree, No. 59424, was entered by JOHN DALTON, Probate Judge, changing Applicant's name from LESLIE KING, JR., to GERALD RUDOLPH FORD, Jr. In the file containing the original Decree there is lodged a letter, dated May 23, 1938, from LESLIE KING, of Riverton, Wyoming, making inquiries concerning the proceedings. Applicant advised that he had last heard from his father by letter, received sometime in 1939, which bore no return address, but was postmarked "Lincoln, Nebraska;" and that neither he nor his mother knew the present whereabouts of his father.

Applicant is a member of the law firm of FORD and BUCHEN, with offices at 621 Michigan Trust Building, S.E., corner of Pearl Street and Ottawa Avenue, N.W. Certificate of Copartnership No. 2300, filed on June 20, 1941, in the Office of the County Clerk of Kent County, Michigan, indicated that the members of that firm are GERALD RUDOLPH FORD, JR., and PHILIP W. BUCHEN.

Mr. ROBERT J. McBAIN, 926 Joslin Street, S.E., Dean, School of Business Administration, University of Grand Rapids, 1607 Robinson Road, S.E., stated that Applicant had been employed last Summer as teacher of law in the School of Business Administration and as Assistant Football Coach. Mr. McBAIN advised that Applicant is a man of excellent personality, who meets people well, and who has shown marked ability as an organizer in preparing the law course to be given during this School year. He stated that Applicant appears to be a good teacher, and is popular with his students, and that he had made a large contribution to the success of last Fall's football season.

Mr. McBAIN stated that he knows Applicant socially, and that he does not use alcohol to excess. He also stated that he considers Applicant to be a 100% American.

REFERENCES

Mr. PAUL G. GOEBEL, 2310 Jefferson Drive, S.E., partner in the sporting goods firm of Goebel and Brown, 12 Monroe Avenue, N.E., stated that he has known Applicant for 18 or 20 years, and is also acquainted with Applicant's family. He said that Applicant is "a splendid young man," popular, and a good mixer, who had made a very good record in High School, at the University of Michigan, and at Yale Law School. Mr. GOEBEL stated that Applicant has temperate habits, does not smoke, drinks rarely and very moderately when he does, and keeps himself in good physical condition. He also stated that, except for injuries to his knees which Applicant had recéntved while playing football, Applicant had enjoyed good health.

Mr. GOEBEL further advised that Applicant has a great deal of "drive" and organizing ability. As evidence of the latter, he cited Applicant's achievements in getting a law practice started, as well as the success of "Curbstone Quarterbacks", a series of weekly luncheons for persons interested in football, promoted by Applicant, which "started from scratch" last Fall and built up to an attendance of 400 at one luncheon.

Mr. GOEBEL stated that Applicant's mother is a "fine, civicminded woman," and that his step-father is a civic leader who is very highly regarded in the community. He could give no information concerning Applicant's real father. Mr. GOEBEL said he was certain that Applicant and his entire family had no un-American tendencies, and were loyal Americans.

Mr. GOEBEL further advised that Applicant had spoken to him about Selective Service, and had stated his willingness to go into the army if called, although he felt that his legal training would fit him to serve his country more effectively than as a selectee, and hence he had made Application for employment with several Government agencies.

Mr. GOEBEL stated that he would be more than willing to employ Applicant himself, and that, although he made it a practice not to recommend people for jobs, he had no hesitation in recommending Applicant for employment and did so without any reservation.

Dr. G. HOWARD SOUTHWICK, 1935 San Lu Rae Drive, S.E., East Grand Rapids, physician and surgeon, 55 Sheldon Avenue, S.E., stated that he had known Applicant for about 12 years, and his family even longer. Dr. SOUTHWICK gave substantially the same information about Applicant and his family as Mr. GOEBEL, adding that Applicant is a person of the highest integrity, and that his half brother, THOMAS FORD, is an Ensign in the United States Navy, presently stationed somewhere on the West Coast.

Mr. THORNE J. BROWN, 937 Chippewa Drive, S.E., partner in the sporting goods firm of Goebel and Brown, 12 Monroe Avenue, N.W., stated that he had known Applicant for at least 10 years. Mr. BROWN gave approximately the same information concerning Applicant and his family as Mr. GOEBEL and Dr. SOUTHWICK, and characterized him as having "good habits." He was particularly emphatic in his recommendation of Applicant.

Mr. FREDERICK E. STILES, 1310 Franklin Street, S.E., member of the law firm of WILLIAMS, STILES, and TUBBS, 538 Michigan Trust Building, S.E. Corner Pearl Street and Ottawa Avenue, N.W., and President, Stiles Incorporated, 155 Eastern Avenue, S.E., stated that he had known Applicant for 7 years and his mother and stepfather for 15 or 20 years. Mr. STILES corroborated the statements concerning Applicant and his family made by the three previous references. He also described Applicant as a "fine fellow", who is intelligent and discreet, possession both drive and ingenuity. Mr. STILES said that he considered Applicant worthy of the highest possible recommendation.

described applicant as a hard worker, a good mixer, and free from any trace of snobbishness. He advised that he did not believe Applicant had been a member of the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE at Yale University, but of an organization of similar name, which he could not recall, supporting the candidacy of WENDELL WILLKIE for President.

advised that Applicant had held isolationist opinions during the past few years, but that he had changed such opinions following the entry of the United States into the War. He also advised that Applicant had expressed to him willingness to serve his country in any capacity for which he might be called.

NEIGHBORHOOD

AT EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mrs. GEORGE J. HARDY, 1012 Santa Cruz Drive, S.E., whose husband is employed in the shops of the Pere Marquette Railroad, advised that she has been a neighbor of the FORD family for the-past four years, and is acquainted with all of them except Applicant, whom she knows barely to speak to because of him having been away from home until recently. She stated that the family are "splendid" people, and that Applicant's brothers, RICHARD and JAMES, who are in School, are well-behaved boys who cause no trouble in the neighborhood. Mrs. HARDY said that she had never heard any scandal concerning any member of the FORD family, or any rumor of their making un-American or subversive statements or having any such tendencies.

The following persons, when interviewed, stated that they had each known Applicant's family for about two years, and gave substantially the same information as Mrs. HARDY:

Mrs. HAROLD J. DAMSTRA, 1022 Santa Cruz Drive, S.E., whose husband is a physician, with offices at 1115 Wealthy Street, S.E., Grand Rapids.

Mrs. BERNARD S. WARREN, 1025 Santa Cruz Drive, stated that she had resided in the neighborhood only a short time and could give no information about Applicant or his family.

AT GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

stated that he has known Applicant for 8 years, having been a Fraternity brother, Delta Kappa Epsilon, of Applicant's at the University of Michigan. He characterized Applicant as a "swell fellow," entirely trustworthy, whose work is entitled to absolute reliance, having no bad habits, and being only an occasional moderate drinker.

stated that Applicant, while attending the University of Michigan, had held the view, shared by many of his contemporaries, that war is entirely futile as a means of settling anything, and was strongly set against taking part in any war which might occur in the future. He stated that out of these views, Applicant evolved an adherence to the isolationist viewpoint when the present War began and aid to Britain was advocated. He further stated that, motivated by his isolationist viewpoint, Applicant joined the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE when it was first organized at Yale University by two of Applicant's friends in the law school. advised he was convinced that Applicant had adhered to the COMMITTEE with pure motives, and not with any subversive intent. He further stated that, when the authorities of Yale University suggested to Applicant that it was embarrasing for the University to have him, while a member of the football coaching staff, active on the COMMITTEE, Applicant promptly severed all connection with the COMMITTEE; and that shortly afterward, Applicant became associated with the WILKIE Organization and worked hard organizing WILKIE-for-President Clubs in Colleges and Universities throughout the country.

He corroborated [_______) in his statement that Applicant's connection with the COMMITTEE had been due to his isolationist viewpoint rather than to any subversive tendencies, and stated that in his opinion Applicant is a loyal American. _______ stated that he would recommend Applicant without reservation for a position of trust and confidence.

Stated that he has known Applicant since he was about four years old. He stated that he

gave substantially the same information about Applicant and his family as the references, named above, and corroborated statements concerning Applicant's connection with the AMERICA FIRST COMMITTEE and his motives in such connection.

AT EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN:

Mr. ALLAN ELLIOTT, Grandville, Michigan, teacher and athletic coach, East Grand Rapids High School, 2021 Lake Drive, S.ET, stated that he has known Applicant since they were both youngsters, having gone to both Junior and Senior High School, and played on the same teams, with Applicant. Mr. ELLIOTT said that Applicant is a good, clean sport of temperate habits, and is an excellent organizer, as he has seen from contact with Applicant in the work of the Grand Rapids Junior Association of Commerce, of which they are both members. He also said that even as a boy, particularly on various athletic teams, Applicant showed outstanding leadership ability.

OVICESSE SET SET SER PRESERVATION

Mr. ELLIOTT advised that Applicant's two half-brothers, RICHARD and JAMES, attend East Grand Rapids High School where he has had an opportunity to observe them, and that neither has ever been the subject of disciplinary action.

Mr. ELLIOTT stated his conviction that Applicant had no un-American sympathies or tendencies, and of Applicant's absolute loyalty to the United States.

Mrs. DONALD T. MAENTZ, 933 Orchare Road, S.E., whose husband is a salesman, stated that she had known Applicant for a number of years, and had attended the University of Michigan while Applicant was matriculating there. She said he is a "swell fellow," entirely free from subversive tendencies, and very highly regarded by the group of men and women of his own age who constitute his closest friends. Mrs. MAENTZ advised that, although she has frequently attended social functions at which Applicant was present, both at the University and in Grand Rapids, she has never seen him drink to excess.

Mr. HOWARD R. DAVIDSON, JR., 942 Dickinson Street, S.E., member of the firm of HOWARD R. DAVIDSON Co. 1480 Buchanan Avenue, S.E., sales agents, stated that he has known Applicant since the days they attended grade school together, and that "they don't come any finer" than Applicant. Mr. DAVIDSON made substantially the same statements concerning Applicant as those made by his references and by other disinterested persons.
