Life is never what it seems to be for any of us. Every human being, regardless of his station in life, searches for answers as to who he is, why he is here. It is in all of us...to attempt to understand the work of the Creator. Often times enlightenment comes in strange ways.

In 1912, a woman in Poland scooped up her children and went to America alone. She did not know the language, had no particular skills, but in her reasoning anything was better than the arranged marriage of her culture. 


In time this story will take on significance for you. You have a most special place in history. Fate intervened and placed you on that same path. How you travel that road will determine your contribution to humanity.




Aerial view of C-5A Crash, April 4, 1975, Saigon
