CAROL BURNETT, who has captivated audiences in every entertainment medium, comes as close as any performer in this country to being "someone who needs no introduction." Currently in her ninth season as star of her own television show (which has three times won an Emmy Award), she has consistently brought bright laughter and glistening song into millions of American homes. Over the past several summers, on hiatus from taping her show, Miss Burnett has returned to the scene of her first fame as a performer, the legitimate stage. She has also found time enough over recent seasons to make several television specials and to star in a hit movie. Her ability to evoke laughter, highlighted by a face that has been described as "equal parts Silly Putty and Wizard Wax," has not only won Carol Burnett awards from critics and the entertainment industry, but also gained her the genuine affection of a large portion of the American public.

For HELEN REDDY it has been a long road up from winning a local talent contest in Perth, Australia, to receiving a Grammy Award for one of this decade's most popular songs; and the title of her fourth album, *Long Hard Climb*, aptly describes what kind of trip it was. But whatever the disappointments or frustrations of her early years in America, they began to disperse when her first single was released in 1970 and were completely blown away when her

song "I Am Woman" became an award-winning success. Her eight albums and seven Gold Records have made Helen Reddy one of this country's leading recording artists.

Her frequent appearances on television, as well as her performances on the live stage and a role in a box office smash movie, have made her a popular all-around entertainer.
